A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WORKERS' COMPENSATION MEDICAL BENEFITS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 386-21.9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§386-21.9 Medical care, services, and supplies for
- 4 firefighters suffering from cancer. (a) If a claim for
- 5 [leukemia, multiple myeloma, non-Hodgkin lymphoma, or cancer of
- 6 the lung, brain, stomach, esophagus, intestines, rectum, kidney,
- 7 bladder, prostate, breast, female reproductive organs, or
- 8 testes] any form of cancers or diseases covered under subsection
- 9 (b) filed by an employee with five or more years of service as a
- 10 firefighter is accepted or determined to be compensable, section
- 11 386-21 shall remain applicable $[\div]$, unless the employer proves
- 12 that the cancer or disease was not associated with the
- 13 firefighting duties; provided that the employer shall be liable
- 14 for medical care, services, and supplies for a minimum of one
- 15 hundred ten per cent, and not to exceed one hundred fifty per
- 16 cent of fees prescribed in the Medicare Resource Based Relative

- 1 Value Scale applicable to Hawaii as prepared by the United
- 2 States Department of Health and Human Services.
- 3 (b) The following cancers or diseases shall be covered
- 4 under this section:
- 5 (1) Adenocarcinoma or mesothelioma of the respiratory
- 6 system;
- 7 (2) Cancer of the bladder, brain, breast, buccal cavity,
- 8 colon, esophagus, intestines, kidney, lung, pharynx,
- prostate, rectum, female reproductive organs, stomach,
- testes, or thyroid;
- 11 (3) Leukemia;
- 12 (4) Malignant melanoma;
- 13 (5) Multiple myeloma; or
- 14 (6) Non-Hodgkin lymphoma."
- 15 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect July 1, 2050.

Report Title:

Firefighters; Workers' Compensation Medical Benefits; Cancer

Description:

Expands workers' compensation medical benefits for firefighters to include coverage for adenocarcinoma or mesothelioma of the respiratory system; cancer of the buccal cavity, colon, pharynx, and thyroid; and malignant melanoma. Specifies that an employer may prove that the cancer or disease was not associated with the firefighting duties to deny medical benefits under workers' compensation law. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

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
