A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUPIL TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State is
- 2 currently experiencing a critical shortage of school bus
- 3 drivers, which has significantly impacted the State's ability to
- 4 provide reliable and efficient student transportation services,
- 5 particularly in rural areas and on the neighbor islands.
- 6 The legislature further finds that the office of the
- 7 governor issued an emergency proclamation relating to school bus
- 8 services on August 2, 2024, to mitigate this pressing issue by
- 9 enabling greater flexibility in student transportation services.
- 10 The proclamation temporarily suspends certain state laws to
- 11 expedite the hiring of qualified drivers, streamline the
- 12 certification process, and allow the use of alternative
- 13 vehicles, including motorcoaches and smaller passenger vans, to
- 14 address the immediate transportation needs of students. These
- 15 measures are designed to ensure that schools can maintain safe
- 16 and consistent transportation options for students despite the
- 17 ongoing driver shortage. Innovative solutions, such as those

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- 1 included in the governor's emergency proclamation, are necessary
- 2 to address the growing demand for student transportation and
- 3 ensure that all students have access to safe, timely, and
- 4 efficient methods of getting to school.
- 5 The legislature also finds that while emergency
- 6 proclamations are essential for immediate action, legislation is
- 7 needed to codify sustainable, structured, and democratically
- 8 validated solutions to the State's pressing bus driver shortage.
- 9 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to authorize
- 10 individuals who possess a commercial driver's license with a
- 11 passenger "P" endorsement to provide pupil transportation
- 12 student services without also possessing a school bus "S"
- 13 endorsement in certain circumstances.
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 286-181, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
- 16 "(b) The department of transportation shall grant
- 17 exemptions for the use of vehicles other than school vehicles
- 18 when the department finds that compliance with this section is:
- 19 (1) Impractical due to the unavailability of school
- vehicles; [or]
- 21 (2) Impractical due to economic factors [-]; or



1	(3) Impractical due to the unavailability of school bus
2	drivers.
3	No exemption shall be granted for the qualifications of
4	individuals driving a bus as defined in section 286-2 and [such]
5	these individuals shall meet school vehicle driver
6	qualifications[-]; provided that commercial driver's license
7	holders shall possess a passenger "P" endorsement, but shall not
8	be required to also hold a school bus "S" endorsement."
9	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
10	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
11	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
