A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE EXECUTIVE OFFICE ON AGING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that low-income subsidy 2 programs such as medicare, medicaid, a medicare savings program, 3 and Extra Help, can help reduce out-of-pocket costs for individuals with limited income by offsetting their medical and 4 prescription drug costs, such as premiums, deductibles, 5 6 copayments, coinsurance, and lifetime late enrollment penalties. 7 The legislature further finds that although individuals with low income, those who speak English as a second language, or those 8 who live in rural areas may qualify for these programs, they may 9 10 have no or limited access to the benefits, as they may not be aware of or need assistance with the application or eligibility 11 12 renewal process.

13 The legislature further finds that the Hawaii state health 14 insurance assistance program, administered by the executive 15 office on aging of the department of health, provides free 16 information and one-on-one counseling on medicare. Since 2022, 17 the program has been receiving a significantly higher volume of

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referrals from med-QUEST to assist uninsured or underinsured
individuals who are losing their medicaid eligibility and need
to find other health coverage. The overflow and referrals are
made to community partners within forty-eight hours to help with
food, housing, utilities, employment, and other needs.

6 The legislature also finds that during the COVID-19 7 pandemic, the med-QUEST division of the department of human 8 services paused disenrollments based on eligibility issues and 9 all medicaid members received continuous uninterrupted coverage 10 through March 2023, regardless of their change in eligibility. 11 Following the 2023 Maui wildfires, the med-QUEST division again paused all eligibility disenrollments statewide until the end of 12 13 2023. However, the med-QUEST division has resumed its annual 14 eligibility redetermination process, and therefore, people have been or will be receiving notices and forms to renew their 15 16 coverage.

17 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish within 18 the Hawaii state health insurance assistance program a temporary 19 medi-medi project to assist the underserved population in the 20 State who may qualify for various low-income subsidy programs to 21 gain access to their benefits.

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1	SECTION 2	. (a) There is established within the Hawaii	
2	state health insurance assistance program a medi-medi project to		
3	assist older adults, medicare beneficiaries, individuals with		
4	disabilities, and other underserved populations who may qualify		
5	for various low-income subsidy programs such as medicare,		
6	medicaid, medi	care savings programs, and Extra Help, to gain	
7	access to their benefits.		
8	(b) The	medi-medi project shall:	
9	(1) Deve	lop and implement a community outreach program;	
10	(2) Stre	amline the application and eligibility renewal	
11	proc	ess for various low-income subsidy programs; and	
12	(3) Prov	ide any other service it deems necessary for the	
13	unde	rserved populations in the State to gain access to	
14	bene	fits under various low-income subsidy programs.	
15	(c) The	executive office on aging shall submit a report of	
16	its findings and recommendations regarding the medi-medi		
17	project, inclu	ding any proposed legislation, to the legislature	
18	no later than	twenty days prior to the convening of each regular	
19	session.		
20	(d) The	medi-medi project shall cease to exist	
21	on .		

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
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1	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general		
2	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so		
3	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and		
4	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal		
5	year 2026-2027 for the Hawaii state health insurance assistance		
6	program, to be expended as follows:		
7	1. \$ for the establishment of one full-time		
8	equivalent (1.0 FTE) position to implement and		
9	administer the medi-medi project; and		
10	2. \$ for other operating expenses.		
11	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the executive		
12	office on aging for the purposes of this Act.		
13	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.

Description:

Establishes a temporary Medi-Medi Project within the Hawaii State Health Insurance Assistance Program administered by the Executive Office on Aging to assist older adults, Medicare beneficiaries, individuals with disabilities, and other underserved populations who may qualify for various low-income subsidy programs to gain access to their benefits. Requires the Executive Office on Aging to submit reports to the Legislature. Appropriates funds.
