A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that community care
- 2 foster family homes (CCFFHs) are a critical resource to keep
- 3 vulnerable kupuna as close to their communities as possible.
- 4 CCFFHs were established to allow for a community-based option
- 5 for individuals requiring a higher level of care. To qualify
- 6 for placement in a CCFFH, an individual must meet the level of
- 7 care requirements for an intermediate care facility (ICF) level
- 8 of care. While the care needs of CCFFH residents are generally
- 9 not considered medically complex, ICF level of care is typically
- 10 provided by a certified nurse aide (CNA) and the overall care is
- 11 managed by a nurse. Requiring the minimum qualification of a
- 12 primary caregiver to be a CNA ensures basic competency in areas
- 13 such as recording vital signs, assisting with medication
- 14 administration, and performing other delegated skilled nursing
- 15 tasks, which is critical to ensuring that care needs of CCFFH
- 16 residents are met. Currently, a CNA certificate is required
- 17 only for CCFFHs offering care services for three clients and is

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- 1 not required for CCFFHs offering care services for two clients.
- 2 However, the legislature believes that, due to the higher ICF
- 3 level of care needed for residents being cared for in a CCFFH,
- 4 the minimum qualification for a primary caregiver at CCFFHs
- 5 offering care should also be a CNA certificate. This
- 6 requirement will provide continuity of care across the entire
- 7 program by requiring CCFFHs offering care services for two
- 8 adults to also maintain a CNA.
- 9 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require a
- 10 primary caregiver in a community care foster family home serving
- 11 two or three clients to be a certified nurse aide or licensed
- 12 nurse with a current certified nurse aid certificate or nursing
- 13 license.
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 321-483, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
- "(b) The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
- 17 91 relating to:
- 18 (1) Standards of conditions and competence for the
- operation of community care foster family homes;
- 20 (2) Procedures for obtaining and renewing a certificate of
- 21 approval from the department;

Report Title:

DOH; CCFFH; Primary Caregiver Requirement; Certified Nurse Aide; Licensed Nurse

Description:

Requires the Department of Health to adopt by rules, a mandate that the primary caregiver caring for two or three clients in community care foster family homes to be a certified nurse aide or licensed nurse who has completed a state-approved training program and other training as required by the Department and holds a current certified nurse aid certificate or nursing license.

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
