## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILD PROTECTION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 350-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 ""Director" means the director of human services."
- 5 SECTION 2. Section 350-1.1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 7 "(c) The initial oral report shall be followed as soon as
- 8 possible by a report in writing to the department; provided
- 9 that:
- 10 (1) If a police department or the department of law
- 11 enforcement is the initiating agency, a written report
- shall be filed with the department for cases that the
- police or the department of law enforcement takes
- 14 further action on or for active cases in the
- department under this chapter;
- 16 (2) All written reports shall contain the name and address
- of the child and the child's parents or other persons

1	responsible for the child's care, if $known[-]$ ; the
2	military status of the child's parents or other
3	persons responsible for the child's care, if known;
4	the child's age $[-]$ ; the nature and extent of the
5	child's injuries[ $ au$ ]; and any other information that
6	the reporter believes might be helpful or relevant to
7	the investigation of the child abuse or neglect; and
8	(3) This subsection shall not be construed to serve as a
9	cause of action against the department, the police, or
10	the department of law enforcement."
11	SECTION 3. Section 350-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	amended to read as follows:
13	"§350-2 Action on reporting. (a) Upon receiving a report
14	concerning child abuse or neglect, the department shall proceed
15	pursuant to chapter 587A and the department's rules.
16	(b) The department shall inform the appropriate police
17	department of all reports received by the department regarding a
18	case of child abuse or neglect, including reports received under
19	section 350-1.1; provided that the name of the person who
20	reported the case of child abuse or neglect shall be released to

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2 person's consent. 3 (c) As soon as practicable after receiving a report 4 concerning child abuse or neglect, the department shall make 5 efforts to determine the military status of the person 6 implicated. If the department determines that the person 7 implicated is a member of the United States military, the department shall notify the appropriate Department of Defense 8 9 family advocacy program that the person has been implicated 10 regarding child abuse or neglect and is the subject of an open 11 investigation. 12 [+e+] (d) The department shall inform the appropriate 13 police department or office of the prosecuting attorney of the relevant information concerning a case of child abuse or neglect 14 when the information is required by the police department or the 15 office of the prosecuting attorney for the investigation or 16 prosecution of that case; provided that the name of the person 17

2	of reported child abuse or neglect cases and shall promptly		
3	expunge the reports in cases if:		
4	(1) The report is determined not confirmed by the		
5	department, an administrative hearing officer, or a		
6	Hawaii state court on appeal; or		
7	(2) The petition arising from the report has been		
8	dismissed by order of the family court after an		
9	adjudicatory hearing on the merits pursuant to chapter		
10	587A.		
11	Records and information contained in a report that is		
12	expunged may be retained by the department solely for future		
13	risk and safety assessment purposes.		
14	[ <del>(e)</del> ] <u>(f)</u> For a confirmed case of child abuse or neglect		
15	that occurred at a licensed or registered child care facility as		
16	defined in section 346-151, the department is authorized to		
17	disclose that the report of child abuse or neglect was confirmed		
18	to any parent or guardian of a child who was enrolled at the		
19	licensed or registered child care facility as defined in section		
20	346-151.		

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1	[ <del>{±}</del>	<u>(g)</u> For a confirmed case of chird abuse of neglect		
2	that occurred at a child care facility as defined in section			
3	346-151 that is operating in accordance with an exclusion or			
4	exemption pursuant to section 346-152 and upon receipt of			
5	consent, the department is authorized to disclose the report of			
6	child abuse or neglect was confirmed to any parent or guardian			
7	of a child who was enrolled at the child care facility.			
8	[ <del>-(g)</del>	] (h) For a confirmed case of child abuse or neglect		
9	that results in a child's death or near fatality, the department			
10	is authorized to disclose to the public:			
11	(1)	The cause of and circumstances regarding the fatality		
12		or near fatality;		
13	(2)	The age and gender of the child;		
14	(3)	Information describing any previous reports and		
15		results of child abuse or neglect investigations that		
16		are pertinent to the child abuse or neglect that led		
17		to the fatality or near fatality; and		
18	(4)	The action taken by the department on behalf of the		
19		child that is pertinent to the child abuse or neglect		
20		that led to the fatality or near fatality		

- 1 [\(\frac{(h)}{l}\)] (i) The department shall adopt rules as may be
- 2 necessary in carrying out this section."
- 3 SECTION 4. No later than , the director of human
- 4 services shall adopt or amend rules, pursuant to chapter 91,
- 5 Hawaii Revised Statutes to authorize the disclosure to
- 6 Department of Defense family advocacy groups any reported
- 7 instances of child abuse or neglect involving a member of the
- 8 United States military, as required by section 350-2(c), Hawaii
- 9 Revised Statutes.
- 10 SECTION 5. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 11 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 12 begun before its effective date.
- 13 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

### Report Title:

DOD; DHS; Child Protection; United States Military; Mandatory Reporting

### Description:

Requires mandatory reports of child abuse or neglect to include the military status of the child's parent or guardian, if known. Requires the Department of Human Services to make efforts to determine the military status of a person implicated in child abuse or neglect and to inform the appropriate Department of Defense family advocacy program of an open investigation of a member of the United States military. Requires the Director of Human Services to amend or adopt rules, to authorize the disclosure to Department of Defense family advocacy programs any allegations of child and abuse or neglect involving a member of the United States military.

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
