# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILD WELFARE SERVICES.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that more initiatives
 must be established to address the unmet needs of children and
 families in the State's child welfare system.

The legislature also finds that the malama ohana working 4 group was established within the office of wellness and 5 resilience to seek, design, and recommend transformative changes 6 to the State's existing child welfare system. In a report 7 submitted to the 2025 legislature, the malama ohana working 8 group recommended establishment of preventative programs and 9 comprehensive services to reduce the risk of families entering 10 11 the child welfare system.

12 The legislature further finds that the child welfare 13 services branch of the department of human services has 14 struggled to fill vacant positions, resulting in high caseloads 15 for existing staff.

16 The legislature also finds that other states have17 successfully reduced the number of families involved in the

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states' child welfare systems by implementing innovative
 programs that include peer support and system navigation,
 resources and financial assistance, and parenting and
 family-strengthening classes.

5 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require the 6 department of human services to establish a five-year child 7 welfare system diversion and intervention pilot program to 8 provide services for families and children involved, at risk of 9 involvement, or at the risk of reinvolvement, with child welfare 10 services.

SECTION 2. (a) The department of human services shall
collaborate with the office of wellness and resilience to design
a child welfare system diversion and intervention pilot program.
The department of human services shall implement and administer
the pilot program.

16 (b) The pilot program shall include:

17 (1) Trained, trauma-informed peer support navigators with
18 lived experience to assist with enrolling families in
19 public benefit initiatives, as well as community-based
20 and cultural programming;

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1 (2)Financial assistance and the provision of resources to 2 meet families' food, clothing, hygiene, housing, 3 parenting, childcare, household, and transportation 4 needs; and 5 (3) A trauma-informed intervention program that improves 6 caregiver-child relationships and parenting skills 7 through teaching and coaching on positive communication, child behavior management, and calming 8 9 and emotional regulation strategies for both the 10 caregiver and child. 11 (C) The department of human services, in collaboration 12 with the office of wellness and resilience, shall submit a 13 report of the department's findings and recommendations 14 regarding the child welfare system diversion and intervention pilot program, including any proposed legislation, to the 15 16 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 17 the regular session of 2030. (d) The department of human services may contract with 18 public and private entities to design, implement, and administer 19 the pilot program. 20 (e) The pilot program shall cease to exist July 1, 2030. 21

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1 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 2 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and 3 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 4 5 year 2026-2027 to design, implement, and administer a child welfare system diversion and intervention pilot program pursuant 6 7 to this Act, including contracting with public and private entities to provide necessary services. 8 9 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 10 of human services for the purposes of this Act. 11 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on December 31, 12 2050.

#### Report Title:

DHS; OWR; Child Welfare System; Diversion and Intervention; Pilot Program; Report; Appropriations

### Description:

Requires the Department of Human Services, in collaboration with the Office of Wellness and Resilience to design a 5-year Child Welfare System Diversion and Intervention Pilot Program to support families and children involved, at risk of involvement, or at risk of reinvolvement with child welfare services. Specifies that the Department of Human Services shall implement and administer the pilot program. Allows the Department to contract with public and private entities to provide necessary services. Requires reports to the Legislature. Appropriates funds. (SD2)

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
