A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WASTE-TO-ENERGY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that using 2 waste-to-energy technology is a promising strategy for reducing 3 the State's solid waste stream. Waste-to-energy facilities divert waste from landfills while extracting energy and valuable 4 materials for recycling. Nationally, there are seventy-six 5 6 waste-to-energy facilities that process up to ninety-four 7 thousand tons of solid waste per day. This produces enough energy each day to power the equivalent of 2,300,000 homes. 8 The 9 legislature believes that a waste-to-energy facility would help 10 the State meet its goal of reducing the solid waste stream while 11 developing sustainable energy sources.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to authorize the Hawaii state energy office to establish a public-private partnership to develop a waste-to-energy generating facility in each county having a population below eight hundred thousand. SECTION 2. Section 196-71, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
