A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TEACHER LOANS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to part III, subpart C, to be
3	appropriately designated and to read as follows:
4	"§302A- Teacher loan forgiveness program; established.
5	(a) There is established a teacher loan forgiveness program to
6	be administered by the department, in partnership with a
7	financial institution whose operations are principally conducted
8	in Hawaii, to provide financial support to individuals who agree
9	to teach as full-time teachers for two years in the Hawaii
10	public school system; provided that priority shall be given for
11	applications from individuals who agree to teach at a school
12	located in a rural area in the State, as determined by the
13	superintendent.
14	(b) An individual applying for the teacher loan
15	forgiveness program shall obtain a license from the Hawaii
16	teacher standards board prior to submitting an application.

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1	(e) The department shall periodically monitor the
2	employment with the department of each applicant who has
3	obtained a tentatively approved application under subsection
4	(d). After an applicant has satisfied all requirements under
5	the teacher loan forgiveness program, the department shall award
6	funds to the applicant; provided that if an applicant has not
7	satisfied all requirements under the teacher loan forgiveness
8	program within four years of the start date in the application,
9	the department shall deny that application and inform the
10	applicant of that denial.
11	(f) The department shall adopt rules pursuant to
12	chapter 91 to implement the teacher loan forgiveness program."
13	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
14	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
15	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and the
16	same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
17	2026-2027 for the teacher loan forgiveness program established
18	pursuant to section 302A- , Hawaii Revised Statutes.
19	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
20	of education for the purposes of this Act.
21	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
