RELATING TO GEOTHERMAL ENERGY EXPLORATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:



- 5 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$6,000,000 or so much
- 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and the
- 8 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 9 2026-2027 for the Hawaii state energy office to conduct the
- 10 statewide environmental assessment and administer the geothermal
- 11 resources characterization program consistent with the
- 12 requirements of this Act.
- 13 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii state
- 14 energy office for the purposes of this Act.
- 15 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 16 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
