SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

RECOGNIZING INTERNATIONAL DARK SKY WEEK.

1 2 3	WHEREAS, the aesthetic beauty and wonder of a natural night sky is a shared heritage of all humankind; and
5 4 5 6	WHEREAS, the experience of standing beneath a starry night sky inspires feelings of wonder and awe and encourages a growing interest in science and nature, especially among young people
7 8	and out-of-area visitors within local communities; and
9 10 11 12	WHEREAS, light pollution has significant negative economic and environmental consequences for the ecology and human health of all communities; and
13 14 15 16 17	WHEREAS, eighty percent of the world's population, including many Hawaii residents, live under a dome of light pollutionexcessive artificial lighting at night that disrupts natural darknessand may never experience the visual wonder or ecological and health benefits of living under a dark sky; and
18 19 20 21 22	WHEREAS, every resident has the right to enjoy darkness and an unpolluted view of the stars, just as they have the right to unpolluted water; and
23 24 25	WHEREAS, Hawaii's unique cultural heritage is linked to star stories and our ancestors' navigational history; and
26 27 28	WHEREAS, Hawaii's endemic birds rely on their view of the moon and stars to find their way; and
29 30 31	WHEREAS, Hawaii's unique marine life has existed under dark skies for thousands of years; and

WHEREAS, tourism is a significant industry in Hawaii, and 1 2 tourists seek experiences that reflect Hawaiian values, including preserving Hawaii's natural beauty and dark 3 4 star-filled skies; and 5 WHEREAS, Hawaii hosts many of the world's largest 6 telescopes and respected observatories, including the Subaru 7 8 Telescope, W. M. Keck Observatory, Gemini North Telescope, NASA Infrared Telescope Facility, James Clerk Maxwell Telescope, and 9 10 others; and 11 WHEREAS, visitors' interest in the State's telescopes and 12 13 dark sky experience demonstrate the economic value of cultivating astrotourism; and 14 15 16 WHEREAS, Hawaii is home to dozens of nocturnal endemic wildlife species that rely on undisturbed night environments to 17 hunt, mate, and thrive; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, DarkSky International is the globally recognized 21 authority on light pollution and has established International 22 Dark Sky Week to raise awareness about light pollution; and 23 24 WHEREAS, International Dark Sky Week aims to provide free 25 education, resources, and solutions to the public to promote the protection and enjoyment of dark skies and encourage responsible 26 27 outdoor lighting; now, therefore, 28 29 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, the 30 House of Representatives concurring, that April 21 through 31 32 April 28, 2025, shall be recognized as International Dark Sky Week in Hawaii; and 33 34 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that each resident is asked to join the Legislature in raising awareness and support for protecting 36 Hawaii's precious dark sky resources; and 37 38
