SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE OFFICE OF THE STATE FIRE MARSHAL TO CONVENE A VEGETATION MANAGEMENT WORKING GROUP TO STUDY, EVALUATE, AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR REGULATIONS THAT DEFINE PROPERTY OWNER OBLIGATIONS FOR VEGETATION MANAGEMENT ON PUBLIC AND PRIVATE PROPERTY TO MITIGATE WILDFIRE RISK.

WHEREAS, on August 8, 2023, catastrophic wildfires swept 1 2 through various communities on the island of Maui; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the wildfires significantly impacted human life 5 and the health, community housing, education, economy, and environment of Maui residents; and 6 7 WHEREAS, the presence of grass, trees, and other vegetation 8 adjacent to or under electric utility lines is a significant 9 10 fire risk; and 11 WHEREAS, in response to the wildfires, in 2023 the House of 12 Representatives established six interim working groups, 13 including the Wildfire Prevention Working Group, which were 14 charged with evaluating specific topics related to the Lahaina 15 wildfire and making recommendations for specific legislative 16 action; and 17 18 WHEREAS, the Wildfire Prevention Working Group found that 19 people are the primary drivers of wildfires in Hawaii, as 20 ninety-nine percent of wildfires are caused by human ignitions; 21 and 22 23 WHEREAS, the Wildfire Prevention Working Group also found 24 that guinea grass, fountain grass, molasses grass, and 25 26 buffelgrass can form continuous fuel beds, ignite easily, attain extremely high fine fuel loads, and grow back more vigorously in 27

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the post-fire environment than the majority of native 1 2 vegetation; and 3 WHEREAS, utility companies have miles of utility lines 4 installed throughout the State on public and private lands, 5 including within the public rights of way and mountainous areas 6 7 of the State; and 8 WHEREAS, a significant portion of these public lands is 9 covered with unmanaged grasses, trees, and other vegetation that 10 may pose a significant wildfire risk; and 11 12 WHEREAS, additional study into appropriate vegetation 13 management will enable the State to develop appropriate 14 policies, regulations, and guidance for the parties responsible 15 for the management of vegetation on public and private lands to 16 mitigate wildfire risk; now, therefore, 17 18 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third 19 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, the 20 House of Representatives concurring, that the Office of the 21 State Fire Marshal is requested to convene a Vegetation 22 Management Working Group (Working Group) to study, evaluate, and 23 make recommendations for regulations that define property owner 24 obligations for vegetation management on public and private 25 26 property to mitigate wildfire risk; and 27 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in its review of vegetation 29 management, the Working Group is requested to consider the 30 following: 31 Wildfire risk mitigation actions being proposed as 32 (1)part of the Hawaiian Electric Company's Climate 33 34 Adaptation Transmission and Distribution and Resilience Program and Wildfire Safety Strategy filed 35 36 with the Public Utilities Commission as Docket No. 2022-0135 and Docket No. 2025-0156, respectively; and 37 38 39 (2) The hazard mitigation plans of electric utilities, 40 including the Kauai Island Utility Cooperative, filed with the Public Utilities Commission as part of a non-41 docketed proceeding under Case No. 2023-04661 in 42
