SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO ESTABLISH A PROGRAM THAT ENHANCES ACCESSIBILITY AND RECREATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES IN STATE PARK WILDERNESS, TRAILS, AND FACILITIES WITHIN THE COUNTY OF MAUI.

WHEREAS, individuals with disabilities face unique 1 2 challenges when seeking to access and enjoy public lands, state 3 parks, and wilderness areas; and 4 WHEREAS, the ability to connect with nature is a 5 6 fundamental right that fosters physical well-being, mental health, and community inclusion; and 7 8 WHEREAS, accessible trail programs designed to enhance the 9 experiences of disabled individuals in outdoor recreational 10 areas have proven effective in fostering inclusivity, enriching 11 lives, and promoting equity; and 12 13 WHEREAS, research demonstrates the positive impacts of 14 programs such as the Colorado Parks and Wildlife Track-Chair 15 Program, which makes adaptive equipment and accessible trails 16 available to individuals having mobility impairments; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, the Track-Chair Program has received widespread acclaim for improving physical and emotional health outcomes 20 among participants and exemplifies a successful partnership 21 between public funding and private sponsorship; and 22 23 24 WHEREAS, similarly, the Mount Shasta Trail Association in California has implemented a series of wheelchair-accessible 25 wilderness trails, including widened paths, specially designed 26 27 viewpoints, and signage for individuals having diverse 28 disabilities; and 29 WHEREAS, the Colorado Parks and Wildlife Track-Chair 30 31 Program and Mount Shasta Trail Association's series of

wheelchair-accessible wilderness trails in California, among 1 others, have significantly increased participation rates in 2 wilderness activities for individuals having disabilities and 3 4 have established a model for other states to emulate; and 5 WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes that Hawaii is renowned 6 for its natural beauty and recreational opportunities, and the 7 State must ensure that its public lands are accessible to all 8 residents and visitors; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the Legislature is committed to ensuring that all 11 individuals, regardless of their physical ability, have an equal 12 opportunity to experience and benefit from Hawaii's unique 13 natural landscapes; and 14 15 WHEREAS, establishing an inclusive program to enhance 16 accessibility provides individuals with disabilities an 17 opportunity to engage with Hawaii's diverse ecosystems while 18 promoting equity and sustainability; now, therefore, 19 20 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third 21 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, the 22 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Land 23 and Natural Resources is urged to establish a program that 24 enhances accessibility and recreational opportunities in state 25 park wilderness, trails, and facilities within the County of 26 Maui; and 27 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and Natural Resources is requested to research and incorporate best 30 practices from successful accessibility programs, such as the 31 programs in Colorado and California, in developing policies and 32 infrastructure for state parks and trails within the County of 33 34 Maui; and 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and 36 Natural Resources is encouraged to collaborate with relevant 37 stakeholders, including disability advocacy organizations, 38 community members, and private entities, to develop and 39 effectively implement the program; and 40 41

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2026, the Department of Land and Natural Resources is requested to submit to the Legislature a report on the progress and proposed actions related to the program, including funding requirements and implementation locations and timelines; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this
Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Chairperson of the
Board of Land and Natural Resources, Mayor of the County of
Maui, and Chair of the County Council of Maui.
