SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE COUNTIES TO ADOPT FLEXIBLE SETBACK REQUIREMENTS FOR STATE BUILDINGS AND FACILITIES TO ENHANCE LAND USE EFFICIENCY AND PUBLIC SERVICE DELIVERY.

WHEREAS, setback requirements, which mandate minimum 1 2 distances between structures and property lines, are established to ensure safety, privacy, and aesthetic standards in urban 3 planning; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii is committed to optimizing the 6 7 use of public lands to serve the community effectively; and 8 9 WHEREAS, strict adherence to uniform setback requirements may limit the State's ability to develop or renovate public 10 buildings and facilities in a manner that maximizes land use 11 efficiency; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, other jurisdictions have implemented flexible setback policies or granted variances to accommodate the unique 15 needs of public buildings, thereby promoting greater density and 16 17 more efficient use of public resources; and 18 19 WHEREAS, this flexibility can lead to improved public service delivery by allowing state facilities to be more 20 21 appropriately sized and located; now, therefore, 22 23 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, the 24 House of Representatives concurring, that the counties are 25 requested to adopt flexible setback requirements or establish 26 27 variance procedures specifically for state buildings and facilities to enhance land use efficiency and public service 28 29 delivery; and 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this measure be 31 transmitted to the mayors and chairs of the county councils of 32
