SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO ADOPT RULES OR OTHERWISE PERMIT RESTAURANTS TO ALLOW DOGS IN DESIGNATED AREAS OF THEIR ESTABLISHMENTS WHILE ADHERING TO HEALTH AND SAFETY REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS, the bond between humans and animals is 1 2 well-documented, with pets being widely regarded as family members; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), 5 codified at title 42 United States Code section 12101 et seq., 6 7 and its implementing regulations under title 28 Code of Federal Regulations section 35.136, ensure that individuals with 8 disabilities are entitled to be accompanied by service animals 9 in places of public accommodation, including restaurants; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, a 2013 study published in the Journal of Environmental Health found no reported health risks associated 13 with allowing pets in restaurants, so long as proper sanitation 14 15 and hygiene measures are maintained; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the United States Food and Drug Administration's Food Code, which sets forth hygiene requirements for food 18 establishments, allows states to establish their own regulations 19 20 regarding animals in dining areas; and 21 22 WHEREAS, nine states have successfully adopted policies permitting restaurant owners to allow dogs on their premises, 23 demonstrating the feasibility of such policies without 24 25 compromising health standards; and 26 WHEREAS, title 7 United States Code section 2143 of the 27 28 Animal Welfare Act promotes humane standards for animals while 29 recognizing the social and economic benefits of responsible pet 30 ownership; and 31

WHEREAS, permitting dogs in restaurants under controlled 1 conditions can enhance the customer experience, foster social 2 interaction, and generate economic benefits for businesses; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, safequards such as requiring dogs to remain leashed, prohibiting employee-dog interactions, and mandating 6 compliance with hygiene regulations ensure minimal disruption 7 and uphold public health standards; now, therefore, 8 9 10 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, the 11 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 12 Health is requested to adopt rules or otherwise permit 13 restaurant owners to allow dogs in designated areas of their 14 15 establishments while adhering to health and safety regulations; and 16 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the State is requested to 19 continue upholding and enforcing the ADA and other federal statutes that ensure the rights of individuals with disabilities 20 while also fostering an environment that accommodates pet owners 21 in a responsible manner; and 22 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director 25 of Health, and Chairman of the Hawaii Restaurant Association. 26 27 28 OFFERED BY: 29
