## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO SHARE INFORMATION ON THE SAFETY AND PERFORMANCE OF COMMERCIAL TOUR OPERATORS TO HELP RESIDENTS AND VISITORS MAKE INFORMED DECISIONS.

WHEREAS, general aviation and commercial helicopter flights 1 are sometimes used by local residents and businesses for 2 commercial purposes, and are popular activities tourists 3 throughout Hawaii; and 4 5 WHEREAS, numerous general aviation and tour operators 6 7 provide commercial air tour flights throughout the islands, including numerous companies often operating on a single island; 8 9 and 10 WHEREAS, not all tour operators employ the same levels of 11 safety precautions and best practices when flying customers, or 12 maintain their helicopters and vehicles with the same degree of 13 care, which have been contributing factors in fatal crashes; and 14 15 16 WHEREAS, pilots at some companies have reported being pressured to continue flying at times and in conditions when 17 they felt it was potentially unsafe or inappropriate to fly; and 18 19 WHEREAS, since 2000, there have been over forty helicopter 20 tour crashes and incidents in Hawaii, resulting in approximately 21 fifty fatalities and nearly as many other serious injuries; and 22 23 24 WHEREAS, commercial air tour operators on Kauai recorded the highest number of fatalities with nearly thirty deaths as a 25 result of helicopter crashes; and 26 27 WHEREAS, general aviation and commercial helicopter flights 28 over residential areas can create safety hazards, such as the 29 2019 crash of a tour helicopter on a street in Kailua, Oahu that 30



1 resulted in three deaths, and could have killed dozens more had 2 it struck a busy area; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the risk of crashes, fatalities, and injuries to 5 helicopter and tour pilots and customers is significantly increased in the absence of currently available safety 6 mechanisms, devices, and best practices; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, following the 2019 crash in Kailua, the Chair of the National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB) stated that 10 "each crash underscores the urgency of improving the safety of 11 12 charter flights by implementing existing [board] safety recommendations," and called for small aircraft flight safety 13 improvements; and 14 15 WHEREAS, NTSB has made repeated recommendations for safety 16 enhancements in the helicopter tour and charter industry, 17 including the use of crash-resistant fuel systems, flotation 18 19 devices for flights over water, and terrain awareness and 20 warning systems to reduce the risk of controlled flight into terrain; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, the implementation of safety measures such as 24 crash-resistant fuel tanks can significantly reduce the risk of post-crash fires, a factor that has contributed to fatalities in 25 26 multiple aviation crashes; and 27 28 WHEREAS, helicopters operating in the State frequently fly over the ocean and remote terrain where emergency landings may 29 30 be required, and the presence of emergency flotation devices are a critical factor in survivability in the event of an unplanned 31 32 water landing; and 33 34 WHEREAS, radar and terrain awareness technology have proven effective in enhancing pilot situational awareness and reducing 35 the likelihood of accidents caused by poor visibility, weather 36 37 conditions, or pilot disorientation; and 38 39 WHEREAS, many companies currently hold minimal insurance policies that may not be sufficient to cover injuries or worse 40 in the event of a crash; and 41 42



WHEREAS, ensuring public access to safety-related 1 information regarding the presence or absence of flotation 2 devices, radar technology, and crash-resistant fuel tanks in 3 helicopters used for commercial and general aviation flights, as 4 well as applicable levels of insurance coverage would empower 5 consumers and the public to make better informed decisions 6 7 regarding their safety and help save lives; and 8 WHEREAS, increased transparency in the aviation industry 9 would encourage helicopter tour operators and charter companies 10 to adopt best practices in aviation safety, thereby reducing 11 12 risks to passengers, crew, and the public at large; and 13 WHEREAS, providing detailed safety information aligns with 14 15 broader efforts to enhance consumer protections and uphold the State's commitment to safeguarding its residents and visitors 16 from avoidable risks; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, providing residents and visitors with safety and performance related information will enable them to make 20 informed decisions; now, therefore, 21 22 23 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, the 24 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 25 26 Transportation is requested to share information on the safety and performance of commercial tour operators to help residents 27 and visitors make informed decisions; and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of 30 Transportation is requested to solicit information no less than 31 annually from commercial air tour operators on whether their 32 helicopters are equipped with, and what percentage of their 33 helicopters are equipped with: 34 35 (1) Crash resistant fuel systems; 36 37 (2) Flotation devices in the event of a water landing; 38 39 40 (3) Terrain awareness and warning systems; and 41

Automatic Dependent Surveillance-Broadcast technology; (4)1 2 and 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of 4 Transportation is requested to solicit information from 5 commercial air tour operators on whether their companies are 6 operating with best practices including information regarding: 7 8 (1) Minimum pilot hours required to fly commercial 9 10 passengers; and 11 12 (2) The amount of insurance coverage provided to cover personal injury and loss for each customer in the 13 event of harm; and 14 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of 16 Transportation is requested to identify and share with the 17 public the numbers of legitimate complaints about safety, noise, 18 or operations received by the Department of Transportation or 19 any other appropriate departments or agencies about each 20 commercial air tour operator operating in the State, and any 21 22 other relevant safety or operational information as may be appropriate; and 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of 25 Transportation is requested to identify and share with the 26 27 public the numbers of legitimate safety-related incidents 28 experienced by each commercial air tour operator over the preceding twenty-four months; and 29 30 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of 32 Transportation is requested to collaborate with the NTSB to 33 identify and develop any other safety criteria that may be appropriate to be shared with the public; and 34 35 36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of 37 Transportation is requested to establish a system of scoring and transparency for these collected criteria to provide the public 38 39 with information in a format easy to visualize and understand, that enables a resident or visitor to know whether or not a 40 41 commercial air tour company has incorporated the particular

criteria, and what threshold or amount of criteria that company 1 has incorporated, where appropriate; and 2 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED in establishing the system of 4 5 scoring and transparency, that the Department of Transportation is requested to also assign an easy to understand overall score 6 or letter grade for each commercial air tour operator that 7 8 clearly distinguishes those commercial air tour operators that employ more or higher levels of safety and other relevant 9 criteria than those that do no; and 10 11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of 12 Transportation is requested to identify the very highest scoring 13 commercial air tour operator each year and recognize and 14 categorize that commercial air tour operator as the "Safest 15 Commercial Air Tour Operator" and categorize commercial air tour 16 operators who did not provide a response with safety information 17 as "Safety Unknown"; and 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of 20 Transportation is requested to provide this information to the 21 public in an online place and format that is easy and simple to 22 find and understand, and keep it updated; and 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of 25 Transportation is requested to share this information with the 26 27 Hawaii Tourism Authority, who is requested to also provide this information to visitors in an online format that is easy and 28 simple to find and understand, and keep it updated; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of 31 Transportation is requested to submit an annual report to the 32 33 Legislature summarizing specific safety-related information for each general aviation and commercial tour operator in the State 34 and post an electronic copy of each report on the Department of 35 36 Transportation's website; and 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 38 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the 39 National Transportation Safety Board, Director of 40 Transportation, and Chairperson of the Board of Directors of the 41 Hawaii Tourism Authority. 42
