SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING EACH COUNTY POLICE DEPARTMENT TO INCREASE ENFORCEMENT AGAINST OUT-OF-STATE VEHICLES OPERATING ON PUBLIC ROADWAYS THAT HAVE NOT BEEN PROPERLY REGISTERED IN THE APPROPRIATE COUNTY.

1 WHEREAS, existing law requires out-of-state vehicles to 2 either register with the appropriate county or obtain a permit 3 that allows out-of-state registration and license plate to remain valid until they expire; and 4 5 WHEREAS, out-of-state vehicles that are not properly 6 registered in Hawaii avoid contributing to the costs associated 7 8 with maintaining public roadways, which creates an unfair burden on law-abiding residents; and 9 10 11 WHEREAS, vehicles that fail to properly register may also pose risks related to vehicle inspections, insurance coverage, 12 and overall safety standards, which can jeopardize the well-13 being of all residents and visitors using public roads; and 14 15 16 WHEREAS, the Department of Customer Services of the City 17 and County of Honolulu alone has experienced a thirty percent decrease in the number of out-of-state permits issued in 18 Honolulu over the past four years; and 19 20 WHEREAS, as a result, the City and County of Honolulu has 21 been reminding motorists with out-of-state license plates that a 22 23 permit is required to operate the vehicle in the State; and 24 25 WHEREAS, the State has a vested interest in ensuring that all vehicles operating on public roadways are properly 26 registered and comply with state and county regulations, 27 including vehicle registration; now, therefore, 28 29
