SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

ENCOURAGING HAWAII INSURERS AND THE HAWAII PROPERTY INSURANCE ASSOCIATION TO REDUCE INSURANCE COSTS ON LOCAL RESIDENTS BY PURSUING SUBROGATION CLAIMS AGAINST POLLUTERS KNOWINGLY RESPONSIBLE FOR WORSENING CLIMATE IMPACTS AFFECTING HAWAII INSURANCE RATES.

WHEREAS, warming sea and air temperatures due to heat 1 trapped by increasing carbon emissions are worsening weather 2 events, including hurricanes and droughts, and destabilizing 3 Hawaii's climate; and 4 5 WHEREAS, overwhelming evidence demonstrates that certain 6 7 responsible polluters in the fossil fuel industry have been aware of their contribution to climate change for decades, and 8 have knowingly engaged in misleading and deceptive practices 9 regarding the connection between their products and climate 10 change, exacerbating climate-related harms; and 11 12 WHEREAS, climate-related harms pose a threat to the health, 13 safety, and security of all residents or, and visitors to, 14 15 Hawaii; and 16 WHEREAS, injured parties deserve to be made whole; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, increasing climate-related disasters and risk have contributed significantly to the destabilization of the State's 20 21 insurance industry, particularly in the property and casualty insurance sector, and has led to rising premiums and increasing 22 non-renewal rates due to payouts for climate-related damages, 23 including the devastating 2023 Maui wildfires; and 24 25 WHEREAS, insurers and injured parties have previously 26 pursued claims against responsible parties related to the opioid 27 epidemic, big tobacco, and other major parties responsible for 28 widespread damages affecting insurance premiums to ensure that 29



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the burden of financial loss does not fall solely on 1 policyholders and taxpayers; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, Hawaii has a compelling state interest in protecting its citizens from climate disasters, extreme weather 5 events attributable to climate change, and harms resulting from 6 7 long-term changes to the climate system, with protection 8 including affordable access to a functioning insurance market in 9 the State; and 10 WHEREAS, the State maintains a compelling interest in 11 protecting consumers from misleading and deceptive practices; 12 13 now, therefore, 14 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third 15 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, the 16 House of Representatives concurring, that this body encourages 17 18 Hawaii insurers and the Hawaii Property Insurance Association to 19 reduce insurance costs on local residents by pursuing subrogation claims against polluters knowingly responsible for 20 worsening climate impacts affecting Hawaii insurance rates; and 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 23 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor; Attorney 24 25 General; Insurance Commissioner; Director of the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism; Chairperson of the 26 Public Utilities Commission; President of the National 27 Association of Insurance Commissioners; and Plan Administrator 28 of the Hawaii Property Insurance Association. 29 30 31 32
