## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL TASK FORCE TO ERADICATE ILLEGAL GAMBLING AND DRUG ACTIVITIES AND TO ESTABLISH COMMUNITY SAFE ZONES.

WHEREAS, the Legislature acknowledges the harmful effects 1 of illegal gambling and drug activities in communities across 2 the State, including an increase in other criminal activities, 3 such as crimes of violence and sex trafficking; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, addressing these criminal activities individually and separately is not the most effective means to deter and 7 eradicate these activities; and 8 9 WHEREAS, a more effective approach involves a collaborative 10 effort among federal, state, and county agencies to examine 11 relevant issues, determine the resources needed to address these 12 issues, and devise a coordinated action plan; now, therefore, 13 14 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third 15 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, the 16 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of the 17 18 Attorney General is requested to establish a special 19 intergovernmental task force to eradicate illegal gambling and drug activities; and 20 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force consist of the 23 following members: 24 25 The Attorney General or the Attorney General's (1)designee, who is requested to serve as the chair; 26 27 The Director of Law Enforcement or the Director's 28 (2) designee; 29 30 The Director of Transportation or the Director's 31 (3) designee; 32

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1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to consider the necessary resources and legislative actions that 2 may be necessary to establish the following: 3 4 5 (1)A statewide program under the Department of the Attorney General to identify and eliminate illegal 6 7 gambling houses and drug houses; and 8 9 (2) Community safe zones throughout the State for the purpose of enforcing zoning and other restrictions on 10 lands that may be used for gambling activities, 11 including casino gaming, regardless of whether the 12 13 activities are legal or illegal; provided that the task force is requested to endeavor to establish, at a 14 minimum, a requirement that lands that may be used for 15 any type of gambling activity, and any structure 16 17 thereupon, be situated more than ten thousand feet from any church, school, or residential area; provided 18 further that the task force is requested to also 19 endeavor to establish an appropriate enforcement 20 21 mechanism for this requirement; and 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the chair and vice chair of the 23 task force are requested to oversee the activities of the task 24 force and lead the decision making of the task force members; 25 and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that no member of the task force be 28 considered an employee for the purposes of chapter 84, Hawaii 29 Revised Statutes, based solely upon that member's participation 30 in the task force; and 31 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 33 submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including 34 any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than 35 twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 36 2026; and 37 38 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force be dissolved 39 upon adjournment sine die of the Regular Session of 2026; and 40 41

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 1 2 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Department of the Attorney General, the Director of Law Enforcement; the Director 3 of Transportation; the respective Chiefs of Police of the 4 Counties of Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai and of the City and County 5 of Honolulu; the respective Directors of the planning or 6 permitting agencies of the Counties of Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai 7 and of the City and County of Honolulu; the United States 8 Attorney, District of Hawaii; the United States Department of 9 Homeland Security; the United States Drug Enforcement Agency; 10 and the Federal Bureau of Investigation. 11
