SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TO ASSESS THE FEASIBILITY OF IMPLEMENTING A SENIOR CITIZEN DISCOUNT PROGRAM TO PROVIDE A TWENTY PERCENT DISCOUNT ON CERTAIN GOODS AND SERVICES FOR LOW- TO MODERATE-INCOME ELDERS IN THE STATE.

1 2 3	WHEREAS, many elders in the State struggle with Hawaii's high cost of living; and
4 5 6	WHEREAS, elders who age at home pay an average of \$4,814 per month for home healthcare costs, in addition to other expenses such as housing, utilities, and food; and
7 8 9 10	WHEREAS, the financial burden on elders can lead to increased stress, reduced quality of life, and difficulty in affording essential needs; and
11 12 13 14 15	WHEREAS, in 2010, the Philippines implemented a senior citizen discount program under Republic Act 9994, also known as the Expanded Senior Citizens Act of 2010, to alleviate the financial strain on elders by providing a twenty percent
16 17 18 19	discount on food, housing, utility services, and other goods and services; and WHEREAS, implementing a similar discount program in Hawaii
20 21 22 23	would provide significant financial relief to the State's elderly residents, ensuring that they can afford basic necessities while maintaining their independence and dignity; and
24 25 26 27 28 29	WHEREAS, the Department of Human Services is well- positioned to assess the feasibility of such a program and determine its potential benefits and implementation challenges; now, therefore,
