## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU, HONOLULU  
POLICE DEPARTMENT, AND HONOLULU PROSECUTING ATTORNEY'S  
OFFICE TO COLLABORATE WITH LOCAL BUSINESSES AND COMMUNITY  
PARTNERS TO IMPLEMENT SAFE AND SOUND PROGRAMS IN EWA BEACH,  
KAPOLEI, AND WAIANAE.

1 WHEREAS, since its implementation in 2022, Waikiki's Safe  
2 and Sound program has proven effective at reducing crime in the  
3 Waikiki area; and

5 WHEREAS, the program has been a collaborative effort  
6 between the Mayor's Office, Honolulu Police Department, Honolulu  
7 Prosecuting Attorney's Office, local businesses, and community  
8 partners; and

10 WHEREAS, since the start of the program, Waikiki has  
11 experienced approximately forty-eight percent fewer drug and  
12 alcohol-related crimes, nineteen percent fewer robberies, thirty  
13 percent fewer burglaries, and twenty-two percent fewer incidents  
14 of criminal property damage; and

16 WHEREAS, to prevent and address crime in West Oahu, areas  
17 including Ewa Beach, Kapolei, and Waianae, would also benefit  
18 from implementing similar Safe and Sound programs; now,  
19 therefore,

21 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third  
22 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, the  
23 House of Representatives concurring, that the Mayor of the City  
24 and County of Honolulu, Honolulu Police Department, and Honolulu  
25 Prosecuting Attorney's Office are urged to collaborate with  
26 local businesses and community partners to implement Safe and  
27 Sound programs in Ewa Beach, Kapolei, and Waianae; and

29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
30 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Mayor of the City
