SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION BENEFITS TRUST FUND BOARD OF TRUSTEES AND DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES MED-QUEST DIVISION TO ENSURE THAT ALL OFFERED HEALTH PLANS PROVIDE TWELVE PER CENT OF MONTHLY INSURANCE PREMIUM PAYMENTS DIRECTLY TO EACH RESPECTIVE MEMBER-PATIENT'S PRIMARY CARE PROVIDER.

WHEREAS, there is a shortage of primary care physicians in 1 the State; and 2 3 WHEREAS, the shortage of primary care physicians is partly 4 due to Hawaii's high cost of living and business costs; and 5 6 WHEREAS, a consistent funding stream would help primary 7 8 care providers stay afloat and continue operating; and 9 WHEREAS, patients already pay monthly premiums for health 10 insurance; and 11 12 WHEREAS, part of the patient premium payments could be used 13 as a consistent funding mechanism for primary care providers; 14 now, therefore, 15 16 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third 17 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, the 18 House of Representatives concurring, that the Hawaii Employer-19 Union Health Benefits Trust Fund Board of Trustees and Med-QUEST 20 Division of the Department of Human Services are requested to 21 ensure that twelve per cent of monthly premium payments for 22 health insurance are paid directly to each respective member-23 patient's primary care provider; and 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the twelve per cent of monthly 26 insurance premiums is requested to be paid to primary care 27 providers without regard to actual services received by the 28 member-patient; and 29
