## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR TO INCREASE KNOWLEDGE AND USE OF NATIVE HAWAIIAN CONCEPTS AND PRACTICES ON HEALTH AND WELL-BEING IN THE STATE COUNCIL ON MENTAL HEALTH.

1	WHEREAS, youth suicide attempts and death rates in Hawaii
2	are highest amongst Native Hawaiians, profoundly impacting their
3	families and communities; and
4	
5	WHEREAS, Native Hawaiians experience unique mental health
6	disparities that pervade their day-to-day well-being and hinder
7	their overall health; and
8	
9	WHEREAS, mental health disparities experienced by Native
10	Hawaiians start in childhood and persist throughout adulthood;
11	and
12	
13	WHEREAS, Native Hawaiians tend to underutilize mental
14	health services, seeking therapy only after a mental illness
15	becomes severe, and are more likely to leave treatment programs
16	prematurely; and
17	
18	WHEREAS, studies on Native Hawaiian mental health
19	illustrate the need for state interventions and confirm that
20	culturally-based programs are four times more successful at
21	addressing Native Hawaiians' specific mental health needs; and
22	
23	WHEREAS, the State Council on Mental Health is responsible
24	for reviewing, evaluating, and advising on the allocation and
25	adequacy of the State's mental health resources; and
26	
27	WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes its obligation to
28	address health disparities throughout the State; now, therefore
29	
30	BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third
31	Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, the
