## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR, STATE BUILDING CODE COUNCIL, BUILDING DEPARTMENTS OF EACH COUNTY, MAYORS OF EACH COUNTY, AND CHAIRS OF THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES STANDING COMMITTEES ON HOUSING TO DEVELOP A COMPREHENSIVE STRATEGY FOR ADOPTING UPDATED BUILDING CODES.

WHEREAS, building codes are a multi-tiered set of rules and 1 standards at the local, state, and federal levels that govern 2 construction to safeguard public safety and the longevity of 3 infrastructure; and 4 5 WHEREAS, increasingly frequent natural disasters make 6 constructing resilient, stable structures of vital importance to 7 8 public safety; and 9 WHEREAS, the State's building codes are governed by 10 multiple bodies, including the State Building Code Council, 11 county-level building and planning departments, and the state 12 Legislature; and 13 14 WHEREAS, Governor Josh Green's 2023 Proclamation Relating 15 to Affordable Housing sought to fast track the construction of 16 housing, especially on Maui, but has had the unintended 17 consequence of suspending the State Building Code Council and 18 adopting unamended building codes formulated by the 19 International Code Council; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, as many of the unamended codes do not apply to the State, such as those for snow, Governor Green issued another 23 proclamation allowing counties not to abide by the 2021 building 24 25 code, meaning contractors now face unclear directives that jeopardize construction and public safety; and 26 27 28 WHEREAS, the State's building codes must now be amended to comply with national standards, offer contractors clarity, and 29



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reflect local issues and updated best practices for expedient, 1 safe construction; now, therefore, 2 3 4 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third 5 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Office of the 6 Governor, State Building Code Council, Building Departments of 7 each county, Mayors of each county, and Chairs of the Standing 8 Committees on Housing in the Senate and House of Representatives 9 are urged to develop a comprehensive strategy for the statewide 10 11 adoption of updated building codes; and 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the comprehensive strategy is 13 requested to be formulated through stakeholder engagement and 14 address the feasibility of compliance with updated codes; and 15 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 17 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Office of the 18 Governor, State Building Code Council, Building Departments of 19 each county, Mayor of each county, and the Chairs of the 20 Committees on Housing in the Senate and House of 21 22 Representatives. 23 24 25 OFFERED BY:
