WHEREAS, the United States-Taiwan Education Initiative was 1 2 launched in 2020 to strengthen cooperation on international education and highlight Taiwan's ability to provide Mandarin 3 language instruction; and 4 5 WHEREAS, given Mandarin's designation as a critical 6 language and Taiwan's plans to be bilingual by 2030, schools and 7 institutions of higher education in both Hawaii and Taiwan are 8 encouraged to enhance their exchanges, as exemplified by the 9 partnership between University of Hawaii and the National Tsing 10 Hua University; and 11 12 WHEREAS, for years, Taiwan has actively engaged in climate 13 change research, supported anti-terrorism cooperation, and 14 worked with its partners to tackle transnational crime; and 15 16 WHEREAS, Taiwan's meaningful participation in bodies such 17 as the World Health Organization, International Criminal Police 18 Organization, United Nations Framework Convention on Climate 19 Change, and International Civil Aviation Organization would make 20 international mechanisms truly global; and 21 22 WHEREAS, the United States has assisted Taiwan in 23 participating in the World Health Organization, International 24 Civil Aviation Organization, and International Criminal Police 25 Organization and will continue to support Taiwan's meaningful 26 27 participation in these and other international organizations; now, therefore, 28 29 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third 30 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, the 31 House of Representatives concurring, that this body joins the 32 33 United States to endorse the participation of Taiwan as an observer in the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate 34 Change, International Civil Aviation Organization, World Health 35 Organization, and International Criminal Police Organization; 36 37 and 38 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body supports the first agreement under the United States-Taiwan Initiative on 21st 40 Century Trade, and encourages the United States Trade 41

Representative to commence negotiations to enter in to a 1 2 bilateral trade agreement with Taiwan; and 3 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body commemorates the 5 State of Hawaii's thirty-second anniversary of sister-state relations with Taiwan and supports mutual beneficiary exchanges 6 7 and cooperation with Taiwan; and 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 9 10 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of the United States; President Pro Tempore of the United States 11 Senate; Speaker of the United States House of Representatives; 12 United States Secretary of State; members of Hawaii's 13 congressional delegation; Governor; and Director of Business, 14 Economic Development, and Tourism. 15
