## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE HAWAII HOUSING FINANCE AND DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION TO DEVELOP A PLAN TO PRODUCE SUFFICIENT HOUSING TO MEET THE STATE'S DEMAND.

WHEREAS, the State is experiencing a severe housing 1 shortage, which has impacted the ability of many local families 2 representing a wide range of household incomes to remain in 3 Hawaii; and 4 5 WHEREAS, according to the 2019 Hawaii Housing Planning 6 Study (2019 Study), there were 532,880 housing units in the 7 State in 2017, of which 45,373 were vacant housing units; and 8 9 WHEREAS, in the period between 2010 and 2018, the State 10 produced 26,152 units, or an average of 2,902 units per year for 11 an average annual growth rate of 0.6 percent, which is lower 12 than the 1.3 percent national average; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the State has one of the highest rates of vacant 15 unavailable units at 11.2 percent; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the 2019 Study projected a demand of 19,328 18 19 housing units for households making sixty percent of the area median income and under; and 20 21 WHEREAS, conversely, the 2019 Study forecasted demand of 22 1,855 rental units for renters earning one hundred twenty 23 24 percent to one hundred forty percent of the area median income over the same five year period, and over 11,800 ownership units 25 26 for households earning one hundred twenty percent or greater of the area median income; and 27 28 29 WHEREAS, these figures indicate that there is much greater demand than what the market is currently supplying; and 30

1 2 WHEREAS, the critical lack of affordable housing is a major barrier to recruiting and maintaining a skilled workforce in the 3 State, with twenty-four percent of Hawaii residents reporting 4 that they intended to move out-of-state, according to the 2019 5 Study; and 6 7 WHEREAS, nearly a quarter of the respondents who planned to 8 9 leave the State said the high cost and limited availability of housing was one of the problems causing them to move; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, prioritizing financing for housing production for a broader range of income segments and producing housing in the 13 most efficient means possible will greatly increase housing 14 15 production in the State; and 16 WHEREAS, Senate Bill No. 26, S.D. 2, H.D. 2, (Regular 17 18 Session of 2025) proposes to establish the Affordable Housing Land Inventory Task Force to assess the viability of affordable 19 20 housing development in transit-oriented zones; and 21 22 WHEREAS, a proactive, innovative approach to developing 23 more housing units to address the State's severe housing 24 shortage is necessary to meet existing demand while ensuring residents can remain in the State; now, therefore, 25 26 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third 27 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, the 28 29 House of Representatives concurring, that the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation is urged to develop a plan 30 to produce sufficient housing to meet the State's demand; and 31 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii Housing Finance and 34 Development Corporation is requested to include the following into the plan: 35 36 37 (1)Density and timing of development for projects identified by the Affordable Housing Land Inventory 38 Task Force, should Senate Bill No. 26, S.D. 2, H.D. 2, 39 (Regular Session of 2025) be enacted in any form; 40 41 (2) How to maximize walkability and density; 42
