## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT TO MORE CLOSELY COOPERATE WITH THE HUMAN RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT UNITS ASSIGNED TO STATE AGENCIES COMPRISING THE STATE'S PUBLIC MENTAL HEALTH CARE SYSTEM TO DETERMINE THE NECESSARY ACTIONS TO EXPEDITE HIRING AND FILLING CRITICAL VACANCIES, INCLUDING SOLUTIONS TO ADDRESS THE OBSTACLES AND CHALLENGES UNIQUE TO THE MENTAL HEALTH CARE WORKFORCE.

1 WHEREAS, the workforce shortage affecting the State and its 2 agencies is the product of numerous identifiable problems and 3 challenges, including obsolete and unproductive recruiting and 4 hiring policies and practices; and

6 WHEREAS, the quality of the State's public mental health 7 care system has diminished, in part due to hiring practices and 8 policies that make it challenging for state agencies to hire and 9 retain the skilled professionals essential to providing 10 effective mental health care services, which affects a range of 11 critical roles, ultimately undermining the system's ability to 12 meet the needs of the community; and

- 14 WHEREAS, the Department of Health, Department of Human 15 Services, Department of Education, Department of Corrections and 16 Rehabilitation, the Judiciary, and other agencies that 17 constitute the Continuum of Care in the State are in desperate 18 need of support as high vacancy rates prevent these agencies 19 from meeting the increasing demand for mental health care 20 services; and
- WHEREAS, in addition to the challenges posed by the current workforce shortage, the persisting stigmas surrounding mental illnesses and mental health care discourage potential applicants and limit the ability of these agencies to attract applicants; and
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WHEREAS, providing care to individuals with serious mental 1 illnesses, emotional disorders, and potentially co-occurring 2 chronic conditions, is a challenging an exhausting occupation 3 4 that often causes workers to experience burnout, compassion fatigue, post-traumatic stress, and the development or 5 exacerbation of other mental health conditions, which high 6 7 vacancy rates can accelerate or further exacerbate; and 8 9 WHEREAS, it is critical that the State effectively recruit and retain additional public mental health care system employees 10 to relieve current employees and deliver more effective mental 11 health care services in the State; now, therefore, 12 13 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third 14 15 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, the 16 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 17 Human Resources Development is requested to more closely cooperate with the human resources development units assigned to 18 state agencies comprising the State's public mental health care 19 system to determine the necessary actions to expedite hiring and 20 filling critical vacancies, including solutions to address the 21 obstacles and challenges unique to the mental health care 22 23 workforce; and 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 25 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Human 26 27 Resources Development. 28 29
