SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE STATE HEALTH PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT AGENCY TO CONVENE A PHARMACY BENEFIT MANAGER WORKING GROUP TO DETERMINE THE BEST POLICIES TO LOWER DRUG COSTS FOR PATIENT CONSUMERS AND INCREASE ACCESS TO HEALTH CARE.

1 WHEREAS, community pharmacies remain the most accessible 2 health care locations, servicing remote and underserved 3 communities with hours that often extend beyond those of other 4 health care offices; and 5

6 WHEREAS, medication price transparency and the reduction of7 medication costs are priorities of this body; and

9 WHEREAS, over the past decade, the use of pharmacy benefit 10 managers, who serve as the intermediary between pharmacies and 11 insurance companies, has increased; and 12

13 WHEREAS, other states have enacted a wide range of policies 14 related to pharmacy benefit managers; and

16 WHEREAS, Senate Bill No. 1509, introduced in the Regular 17 Session of 2025, proposes to require pharmacy benefit managers 18 and health insurers to pass on rebate savings to patient 19 consumers to essentially create a reimbursement rate floor for, 20 and prohibit spread pricing of, prescription drugs; now, 21 therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Administrator of the State Health Planning and Development Agency is requested to convene a Pharmacy Benefit Manager Working Group to determine

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Pharmacy Benefit Manager 1 2 Working Group is requested to evaluate the following priority 3 areas: 4 5 (1)The appropriate state agency to oversee PBM practices; 6 7 (2) PBM reporting requirements and intervals; 8 9 (3) Fair pharmacy audit procedures; and 10 11 (4) Protections from medication under-reimbursements; and 12 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in conducting its evaluation, the Pharmacy Benefit Manager Working Group is requested not to 14 seek or request information that is proprietary, would be 15 considered a trade secret, is protected by the Health Insurance 16 Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, or would violate the 17 Freedom of Information Act or any other federal or state law; 18 19 and 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Pharmacy Benefit Manager 21 Working Group is requested to submit a report of its findings 22 23 and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 24 25 the Regular Session of 2026; and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 28 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Commerce and Consumer Affairs, Attorney General, Director of Human 29 30 Services, Administrator of the State Health Planning and Development Agency, Insurance Commissioner, Administrator of the 31 32 Med-QUEST Division of the Department of Human Services, and 33 Chair of the Board of Pharmacy.
