## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

STANDING WITH TAIWAN TO SUPPORT DEMOCRACY AND SECURITY.

WHEREAS, the United States and Republic of China, known 1 commonly in the United States as Taiwan, are bonded by shared 2 values and a shared commitment to democracy, human rights, the 3 rule of law; and 4 5 WHEREAS, Taiwan acted as a generous and well-intentioned 6 true friend to the people of Hawaii after the August 2023 7 wildfires; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, the people of Taiwan have maintained endearing relationships with the people of the United States; and 11 12 WHEREAS, Taiwan is an indispensable partner in safeguarding 13 peace and stability in the Indo-Pacific region; and 14 15 WHEREAS, Taiwan is the world's largest producer of 16 semiconductors and a leader in information and communications 17 technology and produces over ninety percent of the most advanced 18 chips used in smartphones and data centers; and 19 20 WHEREAS, Taiwan's technology is a key driver of economic 21 growth and national progress, and United States companies and 22 consumers are among the leading beneficiaries of trade with 23 Taiwan's chip sector; and 24 25 WHEREAS, Taiwan is the United States' seventh largest 26 merchandise trading partner (\$158,600,000,000 in total goods), 27 tenth largest export market (\$42,300,000,000), and eighth 28 largest source of imports (\$116,300,000,000); and 29 30

1 WHEREAS, Taiwan is a top United States trade partner and a 2 key link to global technology and manufacturing supply chains; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, the United States Congress passed the landmark 6 Taiwan Relations Act in 1979 to sustain a close bilateral 7 relationship and advance mutual security and commercial 8 interests between the United States and Taiwan; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the Taiwan Relations Act serves as a cornerstone of United States-Taiwan relations, preserving peace and 11 stability in the Taiwan Strait, which is crucial to the 12 13 maintenance of a free and open Indo-Pacific region; and 14 15 WHEREAS, Taiwan has expressed support for, and wishes to 16 become a full member of, the Indo-Pacific Economic Framework; 17 and 18 19 WHEREAS, the intent of the United States-Taiwan Initiative on Twenty-First Century Trade is to develop concrete methods to 20 deepen the economic and trade relationship between the two 21 22 countries; and 23 24 WHEREAS, to strengthen bilateral trade, the government of 25 Taiwan has expressed its desire to sign with the United States a Bilateral Trade Agreement, Bilateral Investment Agreement, and 26 27 an Avoidance of Double Taxation Agreement; and 28 29 WHEREAS, Hawaii and Taiwan established a sister-state relationship in 1993, developing an enduring and mutually 30 beneficial friendship; and 31 32 33 WHEREAS, Hawaii is one of the top exporters of agriculture 34 products to Taiwan; and 35 36 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii Office in Taipei and the 37 Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in Honolulu have worked 38 together in friendship and cooperation to promote future cooperation and exchanges in areas of tourism, agriculture, 39 40 culture, education, and trade; and 41

1 WHEREAS, the United States-Taiwan Education Initiative was 2 launched in 2020 to strengthen cooperation on international 3 education and highlight Taiwan's ability to provide Mandarin 4 language instruction; and 5 6 WHEREAS, given Mandarin's designation in the United States 7 as a critical language, as well as Taiwan's plans to be bilingual by 2030, schools and institutions of higher education 8 9 in Hawaii and Taiwan are encouraged to enhance their exchange 10 programs; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the University of Hawaii and National Taiwan Ocean 13 University have signed a memorandum of understanding on Academic 14 Cooperation and Agreement of Cooperative Master Programs, to 15 improve the bilateral exchange of education; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the United States has assisted Taiwan in participating in the World Health Organization, International 18 Civil Aviation Organization, and International Criminal Police 19 Organization and will hopefully continue to support Taiwan's 20 meaningful participation in these and other international 21 22 organizations; now, therefore, 23 24 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, the 25 House of Representatives concurring, that this body stands with 26 27 Taiwan to support democracy and security; and 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body endorses the 29 participation of Taiwan as an observer in the United Nations 30 Framework Convention on Climate Change, International Civil 31 Aviation Organization, World Health Organization, and 32 International Criminal Police Organization; and 33 34 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body supports further 36 progress on the United States-Taiwan Initiative on 21st-Century 37 Trade; and 38 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body makes it known without any doubt that it stands by our international Democratic 40 partners including Taiwan; and 41 42

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 1 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of the 2 United States; Majority Leader of the United States Senate; 3 Speaker of the United States House of Representatives; United 4 States Secretary of State; United States Secretary of Defense; 5 United States Trade Representative; members of Hawaii's 6 Congressional delegation; Governor; and Director of Business, 7 8 Economic Development, and Tourism. 9
