SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE COUNTY OF MAUI TO ACQUIRE ALL WEST MAUI WATER SYSTEMS THROUGH EMINENT DOMAIN AND TO HOLD THEM IN TRUST FOR THE PUBLIC, WITH MANAGEMENT UNDER THE COUNTY WATER SYSTEM, PURSUANT TO THE PUBLIC TRUST DOCTRINE.

WHEREAS, West Maui's water resources are under significant 1 strain, due to prolonged drought conditions, climate change, and 2 increased demand from private entities controlling approximately 3 eighty percent of these resources; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the 2023 Maui wildfires, exacerbated by invasive 6 grasses and limited water availability, highlighted the critical 7 need for improved water management and accessibility; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the diversion of streams for private use has 10 negatively affected traditional Native Hawaiian agricultural 11 practices and the ecological health of the region; and 12 13 WHEREAS, it is imperative to assert public control over 14 West Maui's water systems to ensure equitable distribution, 15 enhance resilience against climate-induced droughts and 16 wildfires, and uphold the public trust doctrine enshrined in the 17 Hawaii State Constitution; and 18 19 WHEREAS, the County of Maui has recently explored the use 20 of eminent domain to acquire privately held water systems to 21 ensure public control and equitable distribution of water 22 resources; and 23 24 WHEREAS, restoring public control over West Maui's water 25 systems is necessary to ensure equitable distribution, climate 26 27 resilience, and the protection of Native Hawaiian water rights; 28 and 29 WHEREAS, the County of Maui's initiative to consider 30 utilizing eminent domain to acquire water systems aligns with 31 the county's broader effort to ensure sustainable and equitable 32 33 resource management, particularly in the wake of climate 34 challenges and disaster recovery efforts; and



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WHEREAS, restoring public control over West Maui's water 1 systems would allow the State and county to ensure equitable 2 resource distribution, protect local communities, and uphold the 3 4 State's public trust obligations regarding water management; now, therefore, 5 6 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third 7 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, 8 that the County of Maui is requested to acquire all West Maui 9 water systems through eminent domain and to hold them in trust 10 for the public, with management under the county water system, 11 12 in accordance with the public trust doctrine; and 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that water allocation priorities be 14 guided by principles of environmental protection, cultural 15 preservation, and community needs, ensuring access for 16 residents, farmers, and indigenous practices; and 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County of Maui is also 19 20 requested to collaborate with the Department of Land and Natural Resources and other relevant stakeholders to develop a 21 22 management framework ensuring fair distribution of water resources for agricultural, residential, and environmental 23 24 needs; and 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 26 Resolution be transmitted to the Chair of the Board of Land and 27 Natural Resources, Mayor of the County of Maui, and Chair of the 28 Maui County Council. 29 30 31 32 OFFERED BY:
