## SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE TO ADOPT RULES AUTHORIZING RODEOS ON LANDS ZONED FOR AGRICULTURAL USE.

WHEREAS, the State possesses a rich ranching history and 1 cowboy culture preceding that of the American West; and 2 3 WHEREAS, in 1793, Captain James Vancouver presented 4 Kamehameha I with six cows and a bull on which he imposed a kapu 5 to prevent the cattle from being hunted or killed; and 6 7 WHEREAS, over time, the herd flourished and turned feral, 8 becoming a nuisance and danger to Native Hawaiians as the herd 9 would rampage through villages and destroy crops, eat the thatch 10 off the roofs of houses, and occasionally hurt or kill people; 11 12 and 13 WHEREAS, in 1832, Kamehameha III sent one of his chiefs to 14 Alta California to enlist cowboys who could teach his people how 15 to work cattle; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the chief returned with three vagueros who taught 18 aspiring Native Hawaiian cowboys to rope, slaughter, and breed 19 cattle; cure hides; construct fences and paddocks; and ride 20 horses; and 21 22 WHEREAS, Native Hawaiians took quickly to the skills and 23 techniques that the vaqueros introduced, iterated on these 24 skills and techniques, and developed a distinct Hawaiian cowboy 25 culture; and 26 27 WHEREAS, Hawaiian cowboys, known as paniolo, crafted their 28 saddles and gear in a style unique to them, created their own 29 genre of music accompanied by the guitar and ukulele, and also 30 developed a singular Hawaiian style of open-tuning for the 31 quitar called kihoalu, or slack key; and 32 33 WHEREAS, in 1908, three paniolo, Ikua Purdy, Archi Kaaua, 34 and Jack Low traveled to Cheyenne, Wyoming, to compete in the 35 biggest rodeo at the time, Frontier Days; and 36 2025-1950 SR SMA.docx

1 WHEREAS, the three paniolo emerged victorious over many of 2 America's best cowboys, shocking the American public; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, when the three paniolo returned to Hawaii, they were hailed as heroes with poetry and hula being composed in 6 their honor; and 7 8 WHEREAS, authorizing rodeos on lands zoned for agricultural 9 use would honor the State's rich ranching history and paniolo 10 11 culture; now, therefore, 12 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third 13 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, 14 that the Department of Land and Natural Resources is requested 15 to adopt rules authorizing rodeos on lands zoned for 16 agricultural use; and 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 19 Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Board of 20 Agriculture. 21 22 OFFERED BY: Hut Whether & 23 24
