SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE INSURANCE COMMISSIONER TO STUDY THE IMPACT OF UNINSURED MOTORISTS IN HAWAII.

WHEREAS, Hawaii state law requires that all drivers have 1 motor vehicle insurance; and 2 3 WHEREAS, despite this requirement, an estimated eleven 4 percent of motorists in Hawaii operate vehicles without valid 5 motor vehicle insurance coverage, placing financial and 6 emotional burdens on drivers involved in accidents with 7 uninsured motorists; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, the presence of uninsured motorists has led to increased costs of premiums for insured motorists, as insurance 11 12 companies adjust rates to account for the additional risk posed 13 by uninsured motorists; and 14 15 WHEREAS, uninsured motorists can exacerbate the financial strain on victims of motor vehicle accidents, particularly those 16 who may lack adequate uninsured motorist coverage; and 17 18 WHEREAS, a comprehensive understanding of the prevalence 19 and impact of uninsured motorists in Hawaii is essential for 20 21 developing effective policies to address this issue and protect the financial well-being of the State's residents; now, 22 therefore, 23 24 25 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, 26 that the Insurance Commissioner is requested to conduct a study 27 28 on the impact of uninsured motorists in Hawaii, including: 29
