SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE STATE LGBTQ+ COMMISSION AND THE COMMISSION ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN TO REVIEW THE HAWAII REVISED STATUTES AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR GENDER-NEUTRAL LANGUAGE TERMINOLOGY.

WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii is committed to fostering 1 2 inclusivity, equality, and respect for all individuals, regardless of gender identity or expression; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, many existing statutes within the Hawaii Revised Statutes contain binary, gendered language that may not reflect 6 the diverse identities of Hawaii's residents; and 7 8 WHEREAS, the use of gender-neutral language in legislation 9 promotes inclusivity and ensures that all individuals are 10 equally recognized and protected under state law; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, in 2013, the Hawaii State Legislature passed marriage equality, ensuring that same-sex couples have the right 14 to marry, and the rest of the Hawaii Revised Statutes should 15 reflect this legal recognition when addressing married couples; 16 and 17 18 WHEREAS, in 2019, the Hawaii State Legislature expanded 19 gender markers from the false narrative of the gender binary 20 21 that utilizes "F" for female and "M" for male on state identification cards and driver's licenses; and 22 23 24 WHEREAS, now, forms of state identification also include the marker "X" for those who do not identify within the gender 25 binary; and 26 27 WHEREAS, other jurisdictions have undertaken similar 28 efforts to modernize statutory language to be more inclusive, 29 and Hawaii should also ensure that state laws reflect the values 30 of respect and aloha for all; now, therefore, 31 32 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third 33 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, 34



that the LGBTQ+ Commission and the Commission on the Status of 1 Women are requested to collaborate and conduct a comprehensive 2 review of the Hawaii Revised Statutes and recommend amendments 3 to incorporate gender-neutral terminology; and 4 5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the LGBTQ+ Commission and the 6 Commission on the Status of Women are requested to: 7 8 Draft recommended legislation to incorporate gender-9 (1) neutral terminology in the Hawaii Revised Statutes; 10 11 Draft a recommendation for bill review to ensure 12 (2) future legislation incorporates gender-neutral 13 terminology; and 14 15 Submit a report of their findings and recommendations, (3) 16 including proposed legislation containing the 17 suggested statutory amendments, to the Legislature no 18 later than twenty days prior to the convening of the 19 Regular Session of 2026; and 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of the Attorney 22 General is requested to assist the LGBTQ+ Commission and the 23 Commission on the Status of Women in fulfilling these endeavors; 24 25 and · · · 1 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the LGBTQ+ Commission and the 27 Commission on the Status of Women are requested to engage with 28 civil rights experts that specialize in gender identity and non-29 binary issues, such as Lambda Law Hawaii, in fulfilling these 30 31 endeavors; and 32 . 33 ÷
