SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO ESTABLISH A WORKING GROUP ON LOWERING THE LEGAL LIMIT OF BLOOD ALCOHOL CONCENTRATION TO 0.05 GRAMS OF ALCOHOL PER ONE HUNDRED MILLILITERS OF BLOOD.

WHEREAS, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety 1 2 Commission, about thirty-seven people in the United States die in drunk-driving crashes every day; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, that number equates to one person dying every 6 thirty-nine minutes; and 7 8 WHEREAS, in 2022, 13,524 people died in alcohol-impaired driving traffic deaths across the United States; and 9 10 WHEREAS, from 2011 to 2022, at least forty percent of 11 traffic fatalities in Hawaii involved alcohol; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, research published in the Journal of Studies on Alcohol and Drugs in 2012 shows that if a person's blood alcohol 15 concentration (BAC) is between 0.05 and 0.08 percent, their 16 chances of being killed in a crash where only the person's 17 vehicle is involved are at least seven times higher than if the 18 person had not been drinking at all; and 19 20 WHEREAS, reducing the legal BAC limit to 0.05 percent would 21 22 likely lead to fewer instances of impaired driving and its consequences; and 23 24 25 WHEREAS, a 0.05 percent BAC limit would serve as a general deterrent to impaired driving and affects all would-be drinking 26 drivers; and 27 28 WHEREAS, more than one hundred countries have reduced their 29 legal BAC levels to 0.05 percent or lower, including Australia, 30 France, Austria, Italy, Spain, and Germany; now, therefore, 31 32 33 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, 34
