SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO ENSURE THE SAFE MANAGEMENT OF INCINERATOR ASH FROM WASTE INCINERATOR FACILITIES.

WHEREAS, waste incineration facilities reduce every one 1 2 hundred tons of trash to approximately thirty tons of ash; and 3 WHEREAS, the Covanta Honolulu Resource Recovery Venture 4 5 (H-POWER) is the only trash incinerator in the State, operating in Campbell Industrial Park on the island of Oahu and burning up 6 7 to three thousand tons of waste per day, making it one of the largest waste incinerators in the nation; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, the ash produced from H-POWER is currently 11 disposed in the Waimanalo Gulch Landfill in Honokai Hale; and 12 WHEREAS, although combustor ash from trash incinerators is 13 regulated as hazardous waste in several other countries in the 14 15 United States, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) depends on toxicity tests pursuant to the federal Toxicity 16 Characteristic Leaching Procedure, which is based on the risks 17 the ash poses to groundwater contamination; to determine if the 18 ash should be deemed hazardous waste; and 19 20 21 WHEREAS, the EPA's toxicity tests on incinerator ash do not consider the risks the ash may pose via inhalation, ingestion, 22 or dermal contact, which often leads to potentially dangerous 23 waste being classified as non-hazardous; and 24 25 26 WHEREAS, due to its non-hazardous classification, combustor ash that may pose a risk to public health is not processed with 27 adequate care, often being handled and transported without 28 29 sufficient respiratory protections for laborers and containment protocols following disposal, which risks public exposure; and 30 31 WHEREAS, the City and County of Honolulu is currently 32 working with Reworld, formerly Covanta, to develop an ash 33 "recycling" facility at Campbell Industrial Park where 34 incinerator ash would be exempted from being handled as waste 35 36 and used to build roads or for other construction purposes, that



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may subject workers, the public, and the environment to greater 1 exposure to the potential hazards of incinerator ash than if it 2 were properly contained and disposed of responsibly; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, roads and other construction materials will erode over time, releasing more ash particles, including participles 6 7 of highly toxic dioxins and furans, and toxic metals such as arsenic, cadmium, chromium, lead, and mercury; now, therefore, 8 9 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third 10 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, 11 that the Department of Health is urged to ensure safe management 12 13 of incinerator ash from waste management facilities by treating it as solid waste subject to control under part II of chapter 14 342H, Hawaii Revised Statutes; and 15 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City and County of Honolulu 17 is hereby notified that "recycling" or "reuse" of incinerator 18 ash is not protective of public health, may violate state laws, 19 and should not be pursued; and 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 22 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director of Health, 23 Chief Energy Officer, of the Hawaii State Energy Office, and 24 Mayor of the City and County of Honolulu. 25 26 Upe Hallon 27 28
