SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL TASK FORCE TO ERADICATE ILLEGAL GAMBLING AND DRUG ACTIVITIES AND TO ESTABLISH COMMUNITY SAFE ZONES.

WHEREAS, the Legislature acknowledges the harmful effects 1 of illegal gambling and drug activities in communities across 2 the State, including an increase in other criminal activities, 3 such as crimes of violence and sex trafficking; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, addressing these criminal activities individually and separately is not the most effective means to deter and 7 eradicate these activities; and 8 9 WHEREAS, a more effective approach involves a collaborative 10 effort among federal, state, and county agencies to examine 11 relevant issues, determine the resources needed to address these 12 issues, and devise a coordinated action plan; now, therefore, 13 14 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third 15 16 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, that the Department of the Attorney General is requested to 17 establish a special intergovernmental task force to eradicate 18 illegal gambling and drug activities; and 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force consist of the 21 22 following members: 23 24 (1) The Attorney General or the Attorney General's designee, who is requested to serve as the chair; 25 26 (2) The Director of Law Enforcement or the Director's 27 designee; 28 29 30 (3) The Director of Transportation or the Director's designee; 31 32 The respective Chiefs of Police of the Counties of (4) 33 Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai and of the City and County of 34 Honolulu, or their designees; 35

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(1)A statewide program under the Department of the 1 2 Attorney General to identify and eliminate illegal 3 gambling houses and drug houses; and 4 5 (2)Community safe zones throughout the State for the purpose of enforcing zoning and other restrictions on 6 lands that may be used for gambling activities, 7 8 including casino gaming, regardless of whether the activities are legal or illegal; provided that the 9 10 task force is requested to endeavor to establish, at a minimum, a requirement that lands that may be used for 11 12 any type of gambling activity, and any structure thereupon, be situated more than ten thousand feet 13 from any church, school, or residential area; provided 14 further that the task force is requested to also 15 endeavor to establish an appropriate enforcement 16 17 mechanism for this requirement; and 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the chair and vice chair of the 19 20 task force are requested to oversee the activities of the task force and lead the decision making of the task force members; 21 22 and 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that no member of the task force be 25 considered an employee for the purposes of chapter 84, Hawaii 26 Revised Statutes, based solely upon that member's participation in the task force; and 27 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 30 submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than 31 twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 32 33 2026; and 34 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force be dissolved upon adjournment sine die of the Regular Session of 2026; and 36 37 38 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Department of the Attorney 39 General, the Director of Law Enforcement; the Director of 40 Transportation; the respective Chiefs of Police of the Counties 41 of Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai and of the City and County of 42

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Honolulu; the respective Directors of the planning or permitting 1 agencies of the Counties of Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai and of the 2 City and County of Honolulu; the United States Attorney, 3 District of Hawaii; the United States Department of Homeland 4 Security; the United States Drug Enforcement Agency; and the 5 Federal Bureau of Investigation. 6 7 8
