SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TO INCREASE REIMBURSEMENT RATES TO PRIMARY CARE PHYSICIANS FOR SERVICES TO MED-QUEST RECIPIENTS.

WHEREAS, current baseline reimbursements in commercial 1 health insurance, Medicaid, and Medicare plans are low and offer 2 no cost of living increases or overhead reimbursements for 3 physicians; and 4 5 WHEREAS, in addition, these plans offer no increase in 6 reimbursement rates to reflect years of experience, as is common 7 in other fields; and 8 9 WHEREAS, without adequate reimbursement rates, physicians 10 may struggle to maintain a financially viable practice or may 11 refuse to provide care altogether to patients utilizing those 12 plans; and 13 14 WHEREAS, many physicians are opting out of private practice 15 and currently, ten per cent of physicians in Hawaii are in 16 private practice, while ten years ago seventy-five per cent were 17 in private practice; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, increasing reimbursement rates will help ensure that primary care physicians who provide services to med-QUEST 21 recipients can continue to serve this population without 22 experiencing a loss of revenue; now, therefore, 23 24 25 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, 26 that the Department of Human Services is urged to increase 27 reimbursement rates to primary care physicians for services to 28 med-QUEST recipients; and 29 30 31
