SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE STADIUM AUTHORITY TO FINALIZE A CONTRACT FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE NEW ALOHA STADIUM AND TO CONTINUE ITS EFFORTS IN EARNEST TO CREATE THE NEW ALOHA STADIUM ENTERTAINMENT DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, in 2019, the Legislature found that the Aloha
Stadium and lands under the jurisdiction of the Stadium
Authority and Department of Accounting and General Services have
been underutilized, and that the stadium facility has been in
dire need of significant repair and maintenance for many years;
and

WHEREAS, the Legislature further found that redeveloping, 8 renovating, or improving these public lands in a manner that 9 will provide suitable recreational, residential, educational, 10 and commercial areas, where the public can live, congregate, 11 recreate, attend schools, and shop, as part of a thoughtfully 12 integrated experience, is in the best interests of the State and 13 its people and, accordingly, established the Stadium Development 14 District pursuant to Act 268 (2019) to make optimal use of 15 public land for the economic, residential, educational, and 16 social benefit of the people of Hawaii; and 17

19 WHEREAS, since 2019, the Stadium Authority has been 20 overseeing the development of a masterplan of the Stadium 21 Development District, including a new stadium facility, that 22 focuses on reducing negative impacts on surrounding 23 neighborhoods while offering amenities that benefit the broader 24 community; and

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26 WHEREAS, the location of a new stadium facility was 27 carefully selected and strategically located in Halawa for its 28 proximity to transportation infrastructure, including highways 29 and the Honolulu rail system, ensuring accessibility and 30 minimizing traffic disruptions; and

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WHEREAS, the Stadium Authority finalized the environmental
impact statement for the New Aloha Stadium Entertainment
District (NASED) Project in September 2022; and

1 2 WHEREAS, the NASED Project consists of the demolition of 3 the existing Aloha Stadium; design and construction of a new multi-use stadium facility with a variety of amenities and a 4 minimum of twenty-five thousand seats; and mixed-use development 5 of some or all of the surrounding areas within the district, 6 such as housing, retail, hotel, and public spaces, creating a 7 vibrant community hub for both everyday use and major events; 8 9 and 10 11 WHEREAS, the NASED Project will provide community and recreational benefits by offering modern sports and 12 entertainment facilities, enhancing the quality of life for 13 14 residents and visitors; and 15 16 WHEREAS, the smart urban design of the NASED Project aligns 17 with United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals, with considerations for environmental impact and energy-efficient 18 19 designs; and 20 WHEREAS, the construction and ongoing operation of a new 21 22 state-of-the-art stadium facility and mixed-use entertainment district will also create numerous jobs, including construction, 23 hospitality, and retail positions, furthering economic growth 24 and development; and 25 26 WHEREAS, the new stadium facility is crucial for supporting 27 28 the University of Hawaii's football program and other athletic events, which rely on modern facilities for competitive and 29 financial viability; and 30 31 WHEREAS, the new stadium facility and entertainment 32 33 district is also expected to attract large-scale events such as 34 concerts, sporting events, and festivals, which will boost tourism and generate significant income for local businesses; 35 and 36 37 38 WHEREAS, the new stadium facility positions Hawaii to 39 attract national and international sporting events, and will 40 create opportunities to host marquee events like college football championships, soccer matches, and cultural 41 celebrations, which can boost Hawaii's reputation as a global 42

destination and diversify the State's economy beyond traditional 1 tourism; and 2 3 WHEREAS, the procurement method of the NASED Project 4 leverages private investment to reduce the financial burden on 5 the State while ensuring professional development and 6 management, and its mixed-use development model will generate 7 additional revenue beyond ticket sales from retail, dining, and 8 9 housing, making the development of the Stadium Development District more financially sustainable; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the NASED Project is in its final stages of 12 planning and procurement, having already selected Aloha Halawa 13 District Partners as a preferred developer, and the Halawa site 14 15 has already undergone extensive environmental and planning review and completed an environmental impact study, streamlining 16 the process and ensuring readiness for construction; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, the timely procurement and successful delivery of the NASED Project is critical to avoid delays and to leverage 20 the years of work and investment to support Hawaii's economic 21 future, sports culture, and community development; now, 22 23 therefore, 24 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third 25 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, 26 that the Stadium Authority is urged to finalize a contract for 27 the construction of the new Aloha Stadium and to continue its 28 efforts in earnest to create the New Aloha Stadium Entertainment 29 District; and 30 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 32 Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Stadium 33 34 Authority. 35 36 37 OFFERED BY:
