## SENATE RESOLUTION

MAUI AXIS DEER CONTROL AND VENISON INITIATIVE.

1 WHEREAS, eating locally grown food and meats are known to 2 provide a benefit to the local economy and to our citizens; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the people of the State deserve to have access to 5 the many local foods, including locally hunted meat, available 6 on the islands; and 7 8 WHEREAS, the overpopulation of axis deer has been a great detriment to Maui by overgrazing native plants that would 9 10 otherwise aid in mitigating erosion and fire and flood effects; 11 and 12 13 WHEREAS, axis deer are a plentiful source of high-quality 14 delicious protein; and 15 WHEREAS, other states have successfully implemented 16 programs that process and distribute locally hunted meat to 17 18 their community, for example Pennsylvania's Hunters Sharing the Harvest Program, which yearly donates over one hundred thousand 19 pounds of venison to over five thousand food banks; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, the existing United States Department of Agriculture requirements severely limit the financial and 23 practical feasibility of the State's local hunters to 24 successfully maintain a reasonably low population of axis deer 25 26 · and to distribute venison to the community; and 27 WHEREAS, an increase of in-state United States Department 28 of Agriculture certified meat inspectors would lower the cost of 29 inspections for local hunters, provide a benefit to the 30 agricultural industry in the State and make locally hunted 31 32 venison more available and safer for the community to consume; 33 now, therefore, 34

1 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, 2 that the State Department of Agriculture and the County of Maui 3 Department of Agriculture are urged to take further meaningful 4 5 action to address the axis deer overpopulation, including: 6 7 (1)Implementing policies to make United States Department 8 of Agriculture-certified in-state inspectors, certified inspections, and certified processing 9 facilities more accessible, capable, and affordable 10 for local hunters to utilize in order to sell or gift 11 venison; and 12 13 (2) Implementing policies to increase the amount of 14 certified United States Department of Agriculture in-15 state meat inspectors for game mammals; and 16 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the State Department of 18 19 Agriculture and County of Maui Department of Agriculture are urged to convene a joint task force to oversee the County of 20 Maui program that, in coordination with the United States 21 Department of Agriculture certified processing facilities, would 22 aim to investigate and develop plans to make affordable the 23 processing of locally hunted axis deer meat and the distribution 24 25 of this venison to the community; and 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the joint task force is 27 requested to submit a report of the program's accomplishments 28 29 and barriers to the accomplishment of the program with its findings and recommendations, including any proposed 30 legislation, to the Legislature no later than November 30, 2025; 31 32 and 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 34 35 Resolution be transmitted to the United States Secretary of Agriculture, Administrator of the United States Department of 36 Agriculture Food Safety and Inspection Service, Deputy Director 37 of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service, Governor, 38 Chairperson of the Board of Agriculture, Chairperson of the 39 Board of Land and Natural Resources, Mayor of the County of 40 Maui, each member of the Maui County Council, and Director of 41 42 the County of Maui Department of Agriculture.
