SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR TO CONVENE A TEMPORARY WORKING GROUP TO INVESTIGATE THE EXISTENCE AND ENVIRONMENTAL DANGERS OF PER-AND POLYFLUOROALKYL SUBSTANCES AND OTHER RELATED CHEMICALS.

WHEREAS, per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) are a 1 group of man-made chemicals widely used in consumer products, 2 industrial processes, and firefighting foams, and are known to 3 persist in the environment and accumulate in the human body over 4 5 time; and 6 WHEREAS, exposure to PFAS has been linked to significant 7 health risks, including but not limited to cancer, liver damage, 8 9 developmental issues, weakened immune systems, and endocrine disruption; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, PFAS contamination has been detected in water supplies, soil, and air across the United States, raising 13 concerns about the presence of these toxic substances in Hawaii 14 and their impact on the health of its residents and natural 15 resources; and 16 17 18 WHEREAS, Hawaii's ecosystems, including its waterways, bodies of water, fish, and other animals consumed by humans, are 19 integral to the State's food security and cultural practices; 20 and 21 22 ÷ 23 WHEREAS, the geographic isolation of the State and its reliance on a delicate and limited supply of fresh water 24 heighten the need for a thorough understanding of PFAS 25 contamination and its potential impacts on human health and the 26 environment: and 27 28 1.1 WHEREAS, testing in bodies of water and waterways, as well 29 as testing fish and other animals for human consumption, is 30 necessary to identify contamination, assess potential health 31 risks, and ensure the safety of food and water sources in 32 Hawaii; and 33 34



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1 WHEREAS, the creation of a temporary working group can provide a centralized and coordinated approach to assess PFAS-2 related issues, engage with stakeholders, and propose actionable 3 recommendations; now, therefore, 4 5 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third 6 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, 7 that the Governor is requested to convene a temporary working 8 9 group to investigate the existence and environmental dangers of per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances and other related chemicals; 10 and 11 1 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following individuals are 13 requested to serve as members of the working group: 14 15 A representative from the Department of Health; (1) 16 17 (2) A representative from the Department of Land and 18 19 Natural Resources; 20 ; A representative from the Department of Agriculture; (3) 21 22 A representative from the University of Hawaii System; 23 (4) and 24 25 Any other relevant stakeholders, including (5) 26 environmental organizations, industry representatives, 27 28 and community groups; and 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 30 31 to: 32 Identify locations in Hawaii where PFAS contamination 33 (1) is present or suspected, including potential sources 34 such as military installations, industrial sites, and 35 landfills; 36 37 38 (2) Conduct testing in waterways and bodies of water to 39 assess contamination levels; 40

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1 (3) Test fish and other animals consumed by humans to determine the extent of bioaccumulation and potential 2 health risks; 3 4 5 Assess the environmental and public health risks (4) associated with PFAS exposure, particularly in 6 sensitive ecosystems and vulnerable communities; 7 8 9 (5) Review existing regulations and practices to identify gaps in PFAS management and mitigation; 10 11 (6) 12 Propose strategies for testing, monitoring, remediation, and prevention of PFAS contamination; and • 13 14 15 (7) Recommend changes to state policies, programs, and resources to address PFAS-related challenges 16 effectively; and 17 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 20 to submit interim reports to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Sessions of 21 2026 and 2027, with a final report to be submitted no later than 22 23 twenty days prior to the Regular Session of 2028, and that these reports are requested to include findings, recommendations, 24 proposed legislation, and potential funding sources; and 25 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 27 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director of Health, 28 Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources, 29 Chairperson of the Board of Agriculture, and President of the 30 University of Hawaii. 31 OFFERED BY: Mile Hill 32 33 34 ÷ .
