To further meet these needs, WCCHC and 'Elepaio Social Services are collaborating on the development of a Wai'anae Community Resilience Hub at a space adjacent to WCCHC's main campus. Phase 2 of this Resilience Hub will support local economic opportunity through food entrepreneurship and advance food sovereignty through indigenous landscaping and nursery infrastructure. It will feature a certified teaching kitchen, dining room and classroom space that will enable food preparation, distribution, education and safe gathering. 'Elepaio Social Services, a wholly owned nonprofit subsidiary of Wai'anae District Comprehensive Health and Hospital Board, Incorporated dba Wai'anae Coast Comprehensive Health Center (WCCHC), maintains compliancy with the "Standards for the award of grants and subsidies" under Section 42F- 103, Hawaii Revised Statutes. WCCHC is approved by the Department of Health and Human Services/Health Resources and Services Administration to operate as a Federally Qualified Health Center and was designated as a nonprofit organization by the Internal Revenue Service in January 1972. 'Elepaio Social Services was established in November 2020 as the social services arm of WCCHC. WCCHC and 'Elepaio Social Services adhere to a discrimination policy committed to promoting workplace inclusion in all demographic areas and prohibits discrimination against any person on the basis of race, color, national origin, religion, creed, sex, age, sexual orientation, and disability. 'Elepaio Social Services agrees to use state funds only for the established activities of the grant awarded and will not use state funds for entertainment or lobbying activities. 'Elepaio Social Services will grant full access to our records, reports, files, and other related documents for the purposes of monitoring, measuring of effectiveness, and ensuring the proper expenditure of the grant. II. Background and Summary

1. Brief Description of the Applicant's Background

Established on November 11, 2020, 'Elepaio Social Services is a nonprofit subsidiary of the Wai'anae District Comprehensive Health and Hospital Board, Incorporated, doing business as Wai'anae Coast Comprehensive Health Center (WCCHC). 'Elepaio Social Services was created to lead community-based initiatives that address root causes of health inequities on the Wai'anae Coast, with a focus on food access, nutrition, cultural wellness, food sovereignty, and community resilience.

'Elepaio Social Services is governed by a Board of Directors composed of WCCHC board members and community leaders, ensuring strong alignment with community priorities, Native Hawaiian values, and long-term sustainability. WCCHC provides administrative and operational support, including finance, human resources, compliance, and strategic planning, allowing 'Elepaio to concentrate resources on mission-driven programming and community impact.

The organization advances food security, food sovereignty, and food as medicine through initiatives including community food distributions; keiki and kupuna pantries; food justice farmers' markets; food-as-medicine programs; the Backyard Growers Project; and Indigenous Food Nurseries that preserve traditional Native Hawaiian plants and agricultural practices. Together, these efforts strengthen local food systems, honor 'ike kūpuna, and reinforce community resilience.

Building on this foundation, 'Elepaio Social Services is leading development of the Wai'anae Community Resilience Hub, a phased community facility adjacent to WCCHC's main campus. Phase 2 will add a certified classroom kitchen, dining room, and community center to expand food access, wellness programming, and emergency response capacity, while complementing the planned neighboring Department of Hawaiian Home Lands (DHHL) kupuna condominium project serving 180 Native Hawaiian beneficiaries.

2. Goals and Objectives Related to the Request

The goal of Phase 2 of the Wai'anae Community Resilience Hub is to complete a fully integrated community resilience and kupuna-support campus that strengthens food security, wellness, economic opportunity, and emergency preparedness for both kupuna and the broader Wai'anae community. Phase 2 builds upon Phase 1, currently in the permitting phase and anchored by a 10,000 square-foot food warehouse, by adding the kitchen, dining, and community spaces of approximately 3,500 square-feet needed to convert food storage into daily services and emergency response capacity.

- Establish a complete food resilience system by integrating food storage, preparation, and distribution.
- Strengthen aging-in-place supports and kupuna care readiness through congregate meals and nutrition-based wellness.
- Expand emergency food and community response capacity during disasters and supply chain disruptions.
- Create economic opportunity by designing the certified kitchen as an incubator for community food entrepreneurs.
- Advance food sovereignty through Indigenous landscaping, education, and plant distribution.
- Support household self-sufficiency through nursery and greenhouse operations.
- Complement DHHL kupuna housing with proximate, resilient community infrastructure.
- Ensure long-term adaptability by supporting future licensure pathways, including adult day health and PACE-aligned models (Program of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly).

3. Public Purpose and Need to Be Served

The Wai'anae Coast faces persistent challenges including food insecurity, social isolation among elders, limited economic opportunity, and heightened vulnerability to natural disasters. Food insecurity represents an ongoing everyday emergency, disproportionately affecting Native Hawaiian families and kupuna living on fixed incomes.

Phase 1 of the Resilience Hub establishes critical food storage capacity, while Phase 2 enables food preparation, distribution, education, and safe gathering. Together, these phases transform storage into a functioning system that supports daily needs and emergency response.

Phase 2 also supports local economic opportunity through food entrepreneurship and advances food sovereignty through Indigenous landscaping and nursery infrastructure. Proximity to the DHHL kupuna condominium ensures that housing investments are paired with essential community supports.

The State's investment in Phase 2 advances food security, aging in place, economic opportunity, and disaster resilience, ensuring long-term public benefit for one of Hawai'i's most underserved regions.

4. Target Population to be Served

The Resilience Hub serves two priority populations: kupuna and the broader Wai'anae Coast community. Kupuna face elevated risk of food insecurity, chronic disease, and social isolation, while families across the Coast experience persistent food access challenges and emergency vulnerability.

The Hub prioritizes Native Hawaiian residents and directly supports the 180 beneficiaries of the neighboring DHHL kupuna condominium development, while also serving caregivers, families, and community food entrepreneurs.

The PACE program is designed to serve frail older adults (55+), provide comprehensive, fully integrated medical and social services, and enables the participants to age in place rather than enter nursing homes. The program provides medical and clinical services, long-term services and support, social services, and meals and nutrition services.

5. Geographic Coverage

The Wai'anae Community Resilience Hub serves the Wai'anae Coast of O'ahu, including Nānākuli, Mā'ili, Wai'anae, and Makaha. Located adjacent to WCCHC's main campus, the Hub functions as both a neighborhood-based resource and a regional resilience asset for West O'ahu during emergencies.

The Wai'anae Coast is home to 51,965 residents, many of whom face significant socioeconomic challenges, including high rates of poverty, food insecurity, and chronic health conditions. This region is geographically isolated, with limited public transportation, few healthcare facilities, and no acute care hospitals. As the sole safety-net provider in the area, WCCHC is vital to addressing the healthcare and social service needs of the community.

III. Service Summary and Outcomes

1. Scope of Work, Tasks, and Responsibilities

WCCHC's Chief Administrative Officer and Senior Director of Facilities, Planning, and Design will work closely with the construction, engineering, and architectural firms to ensure that the Community Resilience Hub Phase 2 meets city building code requirements, including federal ADA compliance. The Executive Director of 'Elepaio Social Services will oversee program development and operations.

2. Projected Annual Timeline

While construction of Phase 2 is being completed, program development will be ongoing, building on what has already been established with partners committed to food security.

3. Quality Assurance and Evaluation Plans

WCCHC has an active and robust quality improvement program that incorporates all programs under 'Elepaio Social Services. Quality and performance improvement activities of WCCHC and 'Elepaio Social Services represent an integrated multidisciplinary effort by all of its employees.

Medical providers, clinical and non-clinical management, mid-management, and program managers actively address quality management components through the following committees: Peer Review Committee, Quality Improvement Committee, Disaster Preparedness Committee, Health and Safety Committee, and various Leadership Teams.

Improvement of the overall organization is addressed through the Quality Improvement Committee, the Leadership Team, and the Board of Directors.

4. Measure(s) of Effectiveness

The effectiveness of this project will be measured by the securing of funding to support the entire project, the development of partners to support emergency food to the community, the completion of construction based on the projected timeline, and the implementation of food distribution programs and social services to support the most vulnerable throughout the community.

3. Source of Funding Seeking for Fiscal Year 2027

'Elepaio Social Services has developed many close and committed partnerships over the past few years. 'Elepaio Social Services and WCCHC continue to actively fundraise for the current and the full scope of the Community Resilience Hub. Partners include public and private sources and health plans.

4. State and Federal Tax Credits

'Elepaio Social Services is not, and will not, be pursuing tax credits for any current capital projects.

5. Prior Three Years and Fiscal Year 2027 Program Funding

'Elepaio Social Services was awarded CIP grant-in-aid funding from the State Legislature of \$400,000, \$800,000 and \$600,000 for fiscal years 2024, 2025 and 2026, respectively. The contracts have not been received yet.

6. Balance of Unrestricted Current Assets

'Elepaio Social Services has current unrestricted assets of \$100,000 as of October 31, 2025.

V. Experience and Capability

1. Necessary Skills and Experience

WCCHC is a non-profit community health center that has served the community for 53 years. The growth of both the physical and program aspects of the health center demonstrates its experience and ability to plan and manage financial resources and capital development activities. WCCHC and 'Elepaio Social Services work cohesively together in developing this Community Resilience Hub, which has been marked a priority by our board of directors, the community, and external partners.

'Elepaio Social Services will manage the 'Elepaio Social Services Ho'omaui Community Resilience campus as they have been a leader in the emergency food supply chain. In response to high rates of food insecurity and low access to nutritious food, 'Elepaio Social Services has developed the following programs to strengthen Waianae Coast's food system:

- **Makeke Farmers and Green Markets** - 'Elepaio Social Services owns and operates several weekly farmers' markets on the Wai'anae Coast to support Wai'anae food production and access to fresh, locally grown food. These markets provide the community with access and affordability to fresh, locally grown food and a venue for our Wai'anae farmers to bring their goods to the market for direct sale.
- **EBT Double Bucks Program** - Since 2013, 'Elepaio Social Services have offered EBT/SNAP beneficiaries the ability to double their benefits in an unlimited amount on the purchases of fresh local produce and proteins from Waianae farmers and local food producers at our Makeke Farmers' and Green Markets.
- **Produce Prescription Programs** - Since 2018, 'Elepaio Social Services have offered a keiki produce prescription program, the first in the State of Hawaii, to provide \$50/month over six months to keiki with nutrition-related chronic disease or food insecurity. This program has since expanded to offer produce prescriptions to adults and pregnant women for 18 months, tracking changes in BMI, blood pressure, and A1C (if applicable) through a USDA GusNIP research grant.
- **Keiki and School Pantries**- In partnership with the Hawaii Foodbank, 'Elepaio Social Services offers weekly keiki and school pantries providing keiki with 5-pound bags of shelf-stable foods, healthy snacks, and fresh local produce. These pantries operate out of 11 public and charter schools on the Waianae Coast, serving over 3,600 keiki weekly.
- **Kupuna Pantries**- In partnership with the City and County of Honolulu and the Hawaii Foodbank, 'Elepaio Social Services operates five weekly pantry sites that

serve over 1,200 seniors, ages 60 years and up, providing each with healthy ready-to-eat meals, fresh local produce, frozen proteins, and shelf-stable pantry items.

- **Ohana Nights-** In partnership with the Hawaii Food Bank, 'Elepaio Social Services hosts significant community events at our keiki pantry school sites, providing keiki and their families with a healthy dinner, a cooking demonstration of the meal served, and an average of 70 pounds of fresh local produce and shelf-stable ingredients and recipe to recreate the meal at home.

2. Facilities

WCCHC operates from a main center in Wai'anae, satellite clinics in Wai'anae, Nanakuli, Kapolei, Ewa, and Waipahu, six school-based health center sites, and various other business and program sites. 'Elepaio Social Services is integrated within our sites.

WCCHC's 16-plus acre main campus is on Department of Land and Natural Resources and Department of Hawaiian Home Lands parcels centrally located on the Wai'anae Coast. Permanent structures have been constructed or renovated through funding from federal, state, and city government and private foundations.

The Community Resilience Hub will be located adjacent to WCCHC's main campus, central to the 10-mile Wai'anae Coast community, with direct access from Farrington Highway, the main route throughout the coast.


