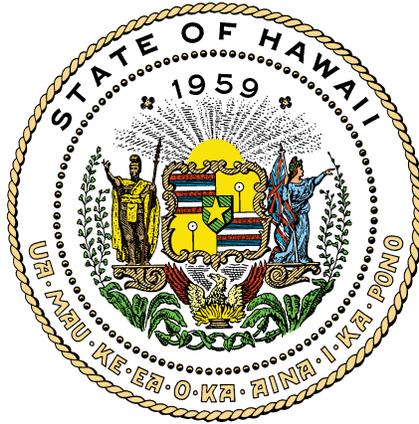



Funding awarded through State Grant-in-Aid would be used for a public purpose as described below in **Section II. Background and Summary**, to support the construction of a 10,000-square-foot indoor gymnasium at Emmanuel Lutheran Church of Maui in Wailuku. The facility will expand access to a safe, affordable recreational, educational, and community gathering space for the Central Maui community, including low- to moderate-income and ALICE households. The project serves a clear public purpose under Section 42F-102, Hawaii Revised Statutes, by promoting youth development, public health, community well-being, and emergency preparedness through a shared-use community facility.

## **II. Background and Summary**

1. A brief description of the applicant's background;

Emmanuel Lutheran Church of Maui (ELCS), located in Kahului, is a longstanding and trusted community anchor, serving individuals and families for over five decades. Founded in the early 1970s, Emmanuel Lutheran Church plays an active role in addressing the spiritual, emotional and practical needs of Central Maui residents, with a particular focus on supporting low- to moderate-income households. Through community programs, pastoral care, and partnerships with local organizations, Emmanuel Lutheran Church provides a welcoming and stable environment that promotes dignity, resilience, and hope for families navigating economic hardship and life transitions.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request;

**Goal:** To develop a safe, accessible, and multi-use indoor gymnasium in Wailuku that expands recreational, educational, and community gathering opportunities for children, youth, families, and the broader Central Maui community, with particular benefit to low-to moderate-income and ALICE households.

### **Objectives**

- Design and construct a 10,000-square-foot gymnasium that supports physical education, youth sports, after-school programming, community wellness activities, and emergency response functions in a safe, weather-protected environment.
- Utilize the gymnasium to expand access to low-cost recreational, athletic, and enrichment opportunities for children and families across Central Maui, including shared use by local youth leagues, nonprofit organizations, and community groups.
- Establish the gymnasium as a flexible, multi-purpose community asset capable of supporting large gatherings, coordinated services, and emergency activation needs, contributing to long-term community stability, youth well-being, and disaster preparedness in Wailuku and surrounding areas.

3. The public purpose and need to be served;

Central Maui faces a significant shortage of safe, indoor recreational and gathering spaces for children and families, a gap that has become more urgent in the aftermath of the August 2023 Maui wildfires. Many keiki continue to experience disruption, stress, and trauma, making access to stable, structured, and physically engaging environments more critical than ever. Outdoor facilities are often unavailable due to heat, rain, or air

quality concerns, and existing indoor options are limited or cost-prohibitive. Without accessible spaces for physical activity, after-school programs, and positive social connection, children, particularly those from low- to moderate-income households, are more vulnerable to isolation, health challenges, and unsafe out-of-school conditions.

Wailuku and contiguous communities have a high concentration of ALICE households, families who are employed yet struggle to afford basic necessities such as housing, childcare, food, and transportation. For these working families, the rising cost of living in Central Maui creates significant barriers to affordable sports, recreation, and extracurricular opportunities for their children. Program fees, facility rentals, and transportation costs often place organized activities out of reach, leaving many keiki without access to safe, structured environments during out-of-school hours. Expanding access to low-cost, centrally located indoor recreation is essential to reducing these disparities, supporting working families, and ensuring that children from all economic backgrounds have opportunities to stay active, connected, and supported.

In response to this growing need, Emmanuel Lutheran Church of Maui proposes the construction of a \$6.1 million, 10,000-square-foot gymnasium on its Wailuku campus. The facility will provide much-needed indoor space for daily physical education, youth sports, structured after-school activities, and community wellness programs, all in a safe, weather-protected environment.

Delivering capital projects of this scale on Maui is increasingly difficult due to the scarcity and high cost of land suitable for development. Emmanuel Lutheran is fortunate to already have appropriate land secured in Wailuku, allowing the project to move forward efficiently and responsibly without the significant financial barriers typically associated with land acquisition. In addition to its role in youth development, the gymnasium will enhance community resilience by serving as a flexible indoor space that can be activated during emergencies, including as a shelter, cooling center, hub for supply distribution or coordination site for relief efforts. With land secured and a demonstrated community need, this project represents a timely, high-impact investment in the safety, stability, and long-term well-being of Maui's children and families.

4. Describe the target population to be served; and

The target population for this capital project includes the broader Central Maui community. The gymnasium will serve keiki and working families from Wailuku and surrounding areas, including many low- to moderate-income and ALICE households who face barriers to safe, affordable recreational and enrichment opportunities. The facility will be available to local youth sports leagues, nonprofit organizations, community wellness programs, and neighborhood groups, expanding access to structured activities, healthy movement, and gathering space. Through shared use, the gym will benefit a diverse cross-section of Central Maui residents, strengthening youth development, family stability, and overall community well-being.

5. Describe the geographic coverage.

The proposed gymnasium will serve Central Maui, with primary geographic coverage encompassing Wailuku, Kahului, Waikapu, and neighboring communities. Located in Wailuku, the facility is centrally positioned and easily accessible to children, youth, families, and community organizations throughout the region. By providing a safe, indoor recreational and gathering space in an area with limited existing facilities, the project will benefit residents across multiple Central Maui neighborhoods, including those disproportionately impacted by economic hardship and recent wildfire-related disruptions. The gym's central location on Waiale Road in Wailuku ensures broad regional access.

### **III. Service Summary and Outcomes**

The scope of work for the proposed gymnasium capital project includes project planning and coordination, engagement of professional consultants, and development of architectural and engineering designs that reflect programmatic needs, safety standards, and shared community use. The capital project will advance through required reviews and approvals, including permitting and compliance with applicable state and county regulations.

Subsequent tasks will include preparation of construction documents, solicitation and evaluation of qualified contractors, and selection of a construction firm through a competitive and transparent bidding process. Construction-related activities will encompass site preparation, building construction, systems installation, and final inspections to ensure the facility meets all applicable codes and standards. Upon completion, the project will include closeout activities and readiness planning to support safe occupancy and multi-use operations by children, youth, families, and the broader Central Maui community.

2. Provide a projected annual timeline for accomplishing the results or outcomes of the service;

Project planning, design, and permitting activities are expected to be completed by June 2027. Following final approvals, construction of the 10,000-square-foot gymnasium is anticipated to begin in late fall 2027, taking approximately 18 months to complete.

Quality assurance for this capital project will be maintained through structured oversight, clear performance standards, and accountability at each phase of development. Professional design consultants and licensed contractors will be engaged to ensure compliance with all applicable state and county codes, safety requirements, and construction standards. Contractors will be required to establish measurable construction milestones tied to pay requests, with progress verified through inspections and documentation before payments are approved. Ongoing coordination and monitoring will ensure adherence to approved plans, schedules, and budgets. Successful project completion will be demonstrated through the issuance of all required building permits, final inspections, and certificates of occupancy, confirming the gymnasium is safe, code-compliant, and ready for use by the community.

Emmanuel Lutheran Church of Maui has a demonstrated history of planning and executing complex capital projects in support of its mission to serve Central Maui families.

Building on this foundation, Emmanuel Lutheran will leverage its institutional knowledge, project experience, and established systems to guide the proposed gymnasium project from planning through completion. The organization is familiar with the regulatory environment, permitting processes, and contractor oversight required for large-scale construction on Maui, reducing risk and ensuring efficient execution. Lessons learned from prior capital efforts will inform decision-making, cost control, and quality assurance throughout the project lifecycle.

Governance and oversight are further strengthened by a Board of Directors composed of individuals with diverse professional expertise, including education, finance, construction, nonprofit leadership, and community development. This breadth of experience enables strong fiduciary oversight, informed decision-making, and accountability at every stage of the project.

A graduate of the Colorado School of Mines with a Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering, Leif has spent more than 25 years with Goodfellow Bros., Inc., serving in progressive leadership roles including Project Manager, Estimator, and Senior Estimator, where he has overseen complex, large scale construction projects with a strong focus on cost control, compliance, and delivery excellence. His deep understanding of construction management, budgeting, and public sector requirements uniquely positions him to provide effective oversight and stewardship of State GIA funds. In addition to his professional career, Leif currently serves as the Congregational President of Emmanuel Lutheran Church of Maui, combining technical expertise with trusted leadership and a strong commitment to accountability, transparency, and the long term sustainability of the church's facilities.

The proposed gymnasium will benefit the community in the same manner as other nonprofit and community-based organizations that utilize shared public facilities. While Emmanuel Lutheran School is a co-located program on the campus, it will not own the facility. The gym will be scheduled and managed by Emmanuel Lutheran Church of Maui to ensure that community programs, nonprofit services, and the public benefit, ensuring compliance with State GIA restrictions prohibiting the use of public funds for private-school only improvements.

**4. Future Sustainability Plan**

Emmanuel Lutheran Church of Maui is pursuing a \$1.5M one-time State GIA capital request to support construction of the proposed gymnasium. Emmanuel Lutheran Church of Maui also plans to secure approximately \$2.0 million through Federal Congressional earmarks and \$2.6 million from private funding sources, including major donors, foundations, and community supporters. Once full capital funding is secured and construction is complete, no additional State GIA will be required for this facility.

Ongoing operations and maintenance of the gymnasium will be sustained through Emmanuel Lutheran Church's existing operating budget, consistent with how current campus facilities are managed. Maintenance, utilities, insurance, and long-term upkeep will be incorporated into annual financial planning to ensure the facility remains safe, functional, and accessible without the need for future State support. This approach reflects responsible fiscal stewardship and ensures the gymnasium remains a self-sustaining community asset that provides long-term benefit to the broader Central Maui community.
