

II. Background and Summary

1. A brief description of the applicant's background;

Hale Mahaolu, a Hawai'i-based 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation, was organized in 1967 and has served as a sponsor, developer, owner, and manager of 17 different properties (approximately 1,300 units) for Maui County including the islands of Moloka'i and Lana'i. As a pillar social services organization, the corporation's purpose is to develop and manage safe, sanitary, decent housing as well as provide supportive services for very low

to moderate income seniors, families, and individuals in Maui County. Our objective is to provide rental housing, related facilities, and supportive services specially designed to meet the physical, social, and psychological needs of our residents and to contribute to their health, security, happiness, and usefulness in an independent living setting.

As an organization that believes in upholding the dignity of the residents we serve, Hale Mahaolu breaks the mold of preconceived notions of what a very low to moderate income housing complex should look like. Our properties are clean, manicured, and very well maintained. Additionally, Hale Mahaolu does more than create housing – we create communities. Our housing sites include community halls which serve as gathering places for social interaction, activities, workshops and more. Our Housing Site Managers work closely with the residents to plan events that can be enjoyed by all. Hale Mahaolu is committed to meeting the needs of the Maui community today and tomorrow.

In addition to providing very low to moderate income housing to Maui's most vulnerable populations, Hale Mahaolu cares for kūpuna throughout Maui County through affordable rental housing, caring senior day care services, nutritious homestyle meals served and/or delivered daily, inclusive recreational activities, compassionate personal care services, and homeownership and housing counseling services for island families.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request;

The primary goal of this capital improvement request is to restore the full capacity of our Meals Program to prepare 1,600 well-balanced meals daily to meet the nutritional needs of Maui County's kūpuna (elderly), mobility challenged residents, marginalized students receiving free or reduced meals during breaks, Maui Adult Day Care Center, and Maui County's Meals on Wheels program recipients. Our Meals Program prepares meals at the Elua Kūpuna Housing Complex, centrally located in Kahului, Maui.

Director Chef Terri Raidmae recently conducted a comprehensive equipment assessment to determine the condition of the kitchen equipment. During her assessment, she discovered a substantial number of her kitchen equipment to be inoperable and/or needing to be replaced to ensure that her team can produce the number of meals needed to continue to serve our Meals Program recipients.

Our objectives for this request include:

1. Purchase seven (7) commercial grade kitchen equipment and arrange for delivery and professional installation.
2. Purchase golf cart to conduct daily transportation of meals to kūpuna living in the Elua Kūpuna Housing Complex.
3. Restore the full capacity of the commercial kitchen located at the Elua Kūpuna Housing Complex to continue to prepare healthy meals for daily distribution to Maui County's most vulnerable populations.
4. Conduct annual servicing of each piece of equipment to ensure the longest possible life cycle of each product.

By purchasing new commercial grade equipment to replace current old, irreparable kitchen equipment, this grant would restore our Meals Program's full capacity to prepare balanced nutritious meals for our program recipients. Currently, Hale Mahaolu's Meals Program produces over 550,000 meals annually for Maui County's most vulnerable populations.

3. The public purpose and need to be served;

Hale Mahaolu strives to support Maui County residents by offering an array of services to help them maintain an independent lifestyle. Since 1990, Hale Mahaolu has addressed the nutritional needs of the kūpuna (elderly) and disabled populations by creating the organization's Meals Program currently situated in Kahului, Maui. Since its inception, the demand for its Meals Program has grown substantially and our staff continues to serve clients a nutritious well-balanced meal delivered right to their dining table.

Food insecurity or the lack of access to enough food for an active, healthy life, remains one of Hawai'i's most urgent challenges. It reflects more than a shortage of food; it reveals the financial trade-offs and systemic inequalities that prevent residents from meeting basic needs such as housing, healthcare, and transportation. According to a recent statewide study on food insecurity, 41% of Maui County's population (67,000 individuals) deals with food insecurity issues. (The State of Food Insecurity in Hawai'i, 2024-25, Hawai'i Foodbank, Maui Foodbank, Hawaii Foodbank – Kauai, and The Food Basket). We are truly proud of our 35-year commitment to helping to address food insecurity in Maui County.

In addition to its meals program for its kūpuna residents, Hale Mahaolu's Kitchen also prepares lunches for popular Maui County's kūpuna programs such as Meals on Wheels and the Maui Adult Day Care Center. Based on our current capacity, Hale Mahaolu helps to meet the food insecurity needs of Maui County's vulnerable populations by producing over 550,000 hot, nutritious meals annually.

4. Describe the target population to be served; and

2025 census data shows that the total adult population in Maui County is **164,007** according to World Population Review, and of these, **31,837** are seniors, indicating that nearly **19.4%** of the adult population are ages 65 or older. Our Meals Program is designed to directly address the nutritional needs of Maui County's kūpuna, disabled, chronically ill, very low to moderate income populations, and school aged children receiving free or reduced lunch benefits through the Hawai'i State Department of Education. Our team partners with Maui County Meals on Wheels and Maui Adult Day Care Centers to deliver and serve hot nutritious meals.

5. Describe the geographic coverage.

As a pillar social services organization focused on elderly care, and affordable housing organization for seniors and families, our geographic coverage includes the islands of Maui, Moloka'i, and Lana'i. Our affordable senior housing sites are located across Maui County including Lāhainā, Wailuku, Kahului, Kīhei, Pukalani, Makawao, Lānai City, and Kaunakakai, in addition to our family housing communities in Lāhainā, Kahului, and Pukalani.

Our Meals Program greatly extends our reach and broaden our sphere of influence far beyond our affordable housing communities. It is through our Meals Program and our alliance partners that our teams are able to reach the broader Maui County community and create county-wide impact.

III. Service Summary and Outcomes

Prior to the submission of this grant application, Hale Mahaolu's Meals Program's Director conducted a comprehensive assessment of all equipment within the commercial kitchen to determine the condition, working status, and projected lifespan of each piece of equipment necessary to prepare hot nutritious meals for our target audiences. Upon close inspection, it was noted that several cooking equipment will require replacement in order to maintain the Program's capacity to produce 550,000 hot nutritious meals per year to address the needs of Maui County's kūpuna and mobility challenged populations served by Hale Mahaolu.

Commercial grade equipment needing to be replaced include:

- Four (4) commercial grade stoves
- One (1) commercial grade steamer
- One (1) commercial grade tilt steamer
- One (1) electric powered golf cart for short range meals and equipment transportation

Should funding be allocated to this capital request, Meals Program's Director will place the listed kitchen equipment and electric golf cart on order within 90-days of receiving funding. All equipment has been spec'd to meet the needs of Hale Mahaolu's Meal Program with price quotes for each product solicited and reviewed by organizational leadership.

Once equipment is received and inspected, professional installers will be contracted to conduct the proper installation process for each piece of equipment to ensure both proper installation and operations. Once operational, Meals Program Director will

conduct proper training for the entire Meals Program team to ensure each member receives proper training on each piece of equipment to avoid improper use that may lead to a shortened product lifespan.

Once fully operational, Hale Mahaolu's Meal Program team will continue its meal preparation operations that currently serves over 550,000 meals per year.

2. Provide a projected annual timeline for accomplishing the results or outcomes of the service;

Hale Mahaolu will deliver the replacement of kitchen equipment outlined in this proposal from July 1, 2026 – June 30, 2027. Based on the availability of funding, Hale Mahaolu is prepared to adjust its project delivery timeline for accomplishing this commercial kitchen equipment capital project. Our team will do everything in its control to ensure that each kitchen equipment is delivered within a reasonable amount of time. Once delivered, our Meals Program team will work with professional installers to ensure that the equipment is properly installed and fully operational.

3. Describe its quality assurance and evaluation plans for the request. Specify how the applicant plans to monitor, evaluate, and improve their results; and

Hale Mahaolu prides itself on not only delivering quality results from its core services but maintaining complete records outlining progress toward stated goals, adjustments made to program deliverables to ensure that the highest quality of services is being delivered to clients, budget vs actual financial reports, and other pertinent data used to measure program or project impacts. Each Program Director is responsible for maintaining accurate and up-to-date data that is used for reporting purposes to government departments, funders, and to the public.

Meals Program Director will maintain all receipts, payments, and contractors that will be used for reporting purposes. Each contractor's work will be evaluated to ensure that each piece of kitchen equipment is properly installed by a qualified professional installer to ensure that factory warranties are not voided due to improper installation.

Our team is comprised of seasoned veterans in the areas of affordable housing, independent living, healthcare, homeownership, charitable organizations, and culinary and nutritional experts with decades of professional experience.

Hale Mahaolu strives to support Maui County residents by offering an array of services to help them maintain an independent lifestyle. In 1990, Hale Mahaolu addressed the nutritional needs of the elderly and disabled by creating the organization's first meal program in its newly constructed kitchen facility. Since then, the demand for this service has grown substantially and our staff continues to serve clients over 1,600 nutritious, well-balanced meals daily delivered right to their dining tables.

2. Facilities

Hale Mahaolu provides its wraparound services for very low to moderate income kūpuna, disabled residents, and families of Maui County at seventeen (17) housing communities in Lāhainā, Wailuku, Kahului, Kīhei, Pukalani, Makawao, Lānai City, and Kaunakakai. For this capital improvement project, Hale Mahaolu's Elua Kitchen will be the site of the kitchen facility that is being improved. Located at 200 Hina Avenue Kahului, HI 96732, the commercial kitchen at the Elua Kūpuna Housing complex serves as the primary site where all current food preparation is conducted.



She is a University of Alaska Anchorage Culinary Arts Program Graduate and ServSafe instructor and proctor.

Funding Partnership Expansion - To ensure that the appropriate level of funding is secured to fulfill the projected costs of the capital improvements planned for the Elua Housing Complex's commercial kitchen beyond the grant period, Hale Mahaolu

Directors will continue to network to establish mutually beneficial partnerships with private foundations, grant making agencies, corporate sponsorship programs and individual donors. As funding opportunities arise, Hale Mahaolu will submit funding requests in the form of grant proposals, donation solicitations, and corporate sponsorship requests letters.

Project Reach Adjustments - Based upon the level of funding our team is able to secure to fund the capital improvements planned for the Elua Housing Complex's commercial kitchen beyond FY2027, Hale Mahaolu Directors will adjust the number of new commercial equipment purchased and professionally installed. Hale Mahaolu's staff will continue to fund raise until all inoperable kitchen equipment has been replaced with fully functioning pieces of equipment that will allow our kitchen staff to operate at full capacity.
