II. Background and Summary

1. A brief description of the applicant's background;

Hawai'i County Economic Opportunity Council (HCEOC) is a private nonprofit organization established in May 1965 and designated as the Community Action Agency (CAA) for Hawai'i County. The agency is part of a nationwide association, the National Community Action Partnership. The Agency is governed by a 12-member tripartite Board of Directors with equal representation from public officials, private-sector leaders, and low-income community members, ensuring accountability, community voice, and public oversight of its operations.

For 60 years, HCEOC has mobilized public and private resources to assist youth, adults, seniors, and individuals with disabilities who face economic hardship and whose incomes are below the federal poverty guidelines. The Agency's mission is to enable individuals and families to achieve greater self-sufficiency and improved quality of life through programs and services that prevent, alleviate, and eliminate the impacts of poverty in Hawai'i County.

HCEOC delivers essential year-round services in transportation, food service, housing stability, energy utility assistance, and energy efficiency. These programs are provided island-wide throughout Hawai'i County, including rural, remote, and underserved communities. They are designed to support access to cost-reducing energy efficiency strategies, nutritious meals, medical and social services, employment opportunities, financial institutions, government agencies, and community resources. HCEOC's transportation services ensure that qualified residents, particularly seniors and individuals with disabilities, can access these vital services and maintain independence.

In addition to direct services, HCEOC administers financial assistance programs that prevent utility disconnection, helping households remain safely housed and connected to essential utilities. By stabilizing households, the Agency reduces reliance on emergency systems and contributes to broader public cost savings.

HCEOC has extensive experience administering State, County, and federal funds and has demonstrated a strong record of compliance with all applicable fiscal, administrative, and programmatic requirements. The Agency maintains sound financial management practices, including independent annual audits, internal budgetary controls, and ongoing oversight by its Board of Directors. These systems ensure the responsible stewardship of public funds and the ability to meet reporting and performance expectations associated with State legislative appropriations.

The Agency's programs are integrated across departments, allowing clients to access multiple services through a coordinated, client-centered approach. HCEOC collaborates with County and State agencies, utility providers, healthcare organizations, nonprofit partners, and community-based organizations to maximize resources, avoid service duplication, and respond effectively to evolving community needs.

With established staffing, infrastructure, and partnerships in place, HCEOC is fully prepared to implement FY2027 operating funds immediately upon award. Continued State legislative support will sustain core operations that deliver measurable public benefit, strengthen household stability, and advance State and County priorities related to housing security, food security, energy affordability, transportation access, and services for seniors, individuals with disabilities, and low-income families across Hawai'i County.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request;

The following goal and objectives are established to ensure HCEOC uses the requested funds in accordance with Chapter 42F, Hawai'i Revised Statutes. HCEOC has defined a measurable goal and objectives for the purchase of new transportation vehicles, ensuring safe, reliable, and equitable access to essential

services for seniors, individuals with disabilities, and low-income residents of Hawai'i County.

Goal: To strengthen and expand essential transportation services in Hawai'i County by replacing aging vehicles and adding new fleet capacity, ensuring safe, reliable, and equitable access to medical care, nutrition programs, employment, and social services for seniors, individuals with disabilities, and low-income residents.

Objective 1: By October 2026, purchase 15 placement vehicles to reduce maintenance downtime, improve safety standards, and ensure compliance with State and Federal transportation requirements.

Objective 2: By November 2026, acquire 6 additional vehicles with disability access equipment to expand transportation capacity and meet growing demand for essential trips, including medical appointments, nutrition services, and senior transportation.

Objective 3: By June 2027, increase transportation access for kūpuna and individuals with disabilities by 5%, enabling participants to remain independent and safely age in place within their communities.

Objective 4: Reduce long-term operating and maintenance costs by investing in newer, more fuel-efficient vehicles, maximizing the impact of the \$200,000 to the State of Hawai'i Department of Transportation, ensuring responsible stewardship of State funds.

The above goal and objectives are supported by the current data collected from October 2024 to September 2025. HCEOC has 15 vehicles: 3 minivans and 12 transit vans. The combined mileage of the vans is 2,141,397. The average mileage of each vehicle is 133,837.31. HCEOC averages 387 passengers per month and 4,535 one-way trips per month. HCEOC has 4,644 unduplicated passengers and 31,189 units for the reporting period.

In Fiscal Year 2027, HCEOC will provide its portion of funds to the State of Hawai'i Department of Transportation to purchase handicap accessible vehicles to support transportation infrastructure and provide services that benefit Hawai'i County residents. While this investment helps sustain current operations, HCEOC's Transportation Department continues to face increasing demand and rising maintenance costs due to an aging fleet. Additional State funding is essential to replace high-mileage vehicles and expand fleet capacity, ensuring uninterrupted access to medical care, nutrition services, and community resources for seniors, individuals with disabilities, and low-income households. Investment in additional vehicles will directly improve service reliability, safety, and efficiency while aligning with the State's priorities for mobility, equity, and community-based care.

3. The public purpose and need to be served;

The requested State of Hawai'i funds will be used for a public purpose to provide essential, equitable services to low-income and vulnerable residents across the geographically diverse and rural communities of Hawai'i County. Funding will support transportation services for seniors (age 60 and older), individuals with disabilities, and low-income households, enabling them to access social services, essential medical appointments, and food services to address food insecurity. Transportation services help mitigate the impacts of the high cost of living, reduce barriers to access in rural and underserved areas, and promote health, safety, stability, and self-sufficiency for residents most in need. Hawai'i County faces persistent challenges, including geographic isolation, limited public transportation, rising housing and energy costs, and higher rates of food insecurity among seniors and low-income households, all of which necessitate continued public investment in coordinated, community-based support services.

4. Describe the target population to be served; and

HCEOC serves low-income individuals and households, which include seniors age 60 and older and individuals with disabilities residing in Hawai'i County, where persistent poverty, geographic isolation, and high cost of living create barriers to accessing essential services. In Hawai'i County, 17% of households live in poverty, totaling 12,569 households out of 73,933. It is the highest level of poverty in the state. The state level is 10%. The County has the largest land area in the state (4,028 square miles); the next-largest island is Maui, with 727 square miles. There is limited public transportation in rural districts, and progress has been made, but it is still a work in progress.

There is an aging population, which relies on others, such as family members and transportation services. A high percentage of households in the county spend an unsustainable share of their income on housing, utilities, and food. HCEOC's transportation-based services prioritize residents experiencing housing and energy insecurity, food insecurity, disability-related mobility limitations, and fixed or limited income, particularly in rural and underserved communities where access to services is constrained by distance, cost, and infrastructure. 5. Describe the geographic coverage.

The service area is countywide. All residents of Hawai'i County are eligible to receive services, provided they meet the applicable program guidelines and eligibility requirements.

III. Service Summary and Outcomes

1. Describe the scope of work, tasks and responsibilities;

The scope of work for this request includes the following tasks and responsibilities, which will be carried out upon award and release of State funds:

1. **Project Planning and Oversight:** HCEOC's Executive Director, Deputy Director, Director of Operations, and Transportation Department Director will collaborate to develop and finalize the project implementation plan. This includes confirming procurement procedures and timelines, and ensuring alignment with approved program goals and objectives, contingent upon receipt of State GIA funds.
 2. **Procurement of Vehicles:** Vehicles will be purchased based on demonstrated operational need within the Transportation Department. HCEOC will conduct all procurements in accordance with applicable State and organizational procurement policies to ensure compliance, transparency, and cost-effectiveness.
 3. **Pre-Implementation Planning:** While awaiting vehicle delivery, the Transportation Department Director, administrative team, and program staff will prepare for deployment by refining service plans, updating internal procedures, coordinating staffing and training needs, and conducting outreach and communications necessary to support program implementation.
 4. **Program Implementation:** Upon confirmation of vehicle delivery dates, the Transportation Department Director, administrative team, and staff will initiate full program implementation, utilizing the new vehicles to carry out approved goals and objectives and expand or enhance transportation services as outlined in the proposal.
2. Provide a projected annual timeline for accomplishing the results or outcomes of the service;

Months 1–2: Initiate procurement activities for approved vehicles in accordance with applicable procurement requirements. Concurrently, conduct program planning, internal coordination, and implementation strategizing to ensure readiness upon vehicle delivery.

Months 3–4: Receive and place vehicles into service. Programs will begin utilizing the vehicles to deliver approved transportation services and advance program goals and objectives.

Months 5–End of Vehicle Useful Life (or Ongoing): Programs will fully integrate the vehicles into daily operations to support ongoing service delivery and meet annual fiscal year performance goals and objectives.

This timeline is contingent on vehicle availability and the dealership's delivery schedules and may be adjusted as necessary to ensure compliance and effective program implementation.

3. Describe its quality assurance and evaluation plans for the request. Specify how the applicant plans to monitor, evaluate, and improve their results; and

The Executive Director, Deputy Director, or Director of Operations will provide overall project oversight, quality assurance, and evaluation to ensure compliance with State grant requirements, procurement standards, and program performance expectations. The Executive Director brings direct experience in transportation programs. The Executive Director, Deputy Director, and Director of Operations have the ability and experience to monitor implementation to ensure outcomes, timelines, and reporting obligations are met.

Transportation Department Director and staff will be responsible for ongoing quality assurance within their department, including monitoring service delivery, tracking performance metrics, and assessing progress toward stated goals and objectives. Program-level data will be reviewed monthly through standardized internal reports to evaluate outcomes, identify challenges, and implement corrective actions as needed.

Monthly management meetings involving the Department Director, the Fiscal Officer, Executive Director, Deputy Director, Director of Operations, and Resource and Development Coordinator will be used to review financial expenditures, program performance, compliance status, and emerging needs. This structured review process ensures fiscal accountability, continuous improvement, and alignment with the approved scope of work and public purpose of the grant.

HCEOC will implement the following processes to ensure the project is completed properly and on time. These measures will include, but are not limited to:

Measure 1: By October 2026, purchase 15 placement vehicles to reduce maintenance downtime, improve safety standards, and ensure compliance with State and Federal transportation requirements.

Performance Indicators and Targets:

- Vehicles replaced: Baseline: 0 → Target: 15 replacement vehicles
- Vehicle breakdowns/service interruptions: Baseline: High due to average vehicle mileage of 133,837 miles → Target: 20% reduction in breakdown-related service disruptions by June 2027
- Safety inspection outcomes: Baseline: Aging fleet with increased inspection risk → Target: 100% pass rate on State and Federal safety inspections

- Hawai'i County Economic Opportunity Council operates 15 vehicles (3 minivans, 12 transit vans).

- One-way trips provided: Baseline: 4,535 trips per month → Target: 4,760 trips per month (≈ 5% increase) by June 2027
- Trip denials and wait times: Baseline: Capacity-constrained scheduling → Target: 10% reduction in trip denials and average wait times
- Service coverage: Baseline: Limited flexibility in rural routes → Target: Expanded coverage in at least two rural or underserved service areas

Baseline Data (Oct 2024–Sept 2025):

- Average 387 passengers per month
- 31,189 total service units delivered during the reporting period

Measure 3: By June 2027, increase transportation access for kūpuna and individuals with disabilities by 5%, enabling participants to remain independent and safely age in place within their communities.

Performance Indicators and Targets:

- Unduplicated passengers served: Baseline: 4,644 individuals → Target: 4,876 unduplicated passengers (5% increase)
- Seniors and individuals with disabilities served: Baseline: Current annual service levels → Target: 5% increase in senior and disability-related trips
- On-time trip completion: Baseline: Current operational performance → Target: ≥95% on-time trip completion rate
- Participant satisfaction: Baseline: Informal feedback → Target: ≥90% of surveyed participants reporting satisfaction with transportation services

Measure 4: Reduce long-term operating and maintenance costs by investing in newer, more fuel-efficient vehicles, maximizing the impact of the \$200,000 to the State of Hawai'i Department of Transportation, ensuring responsible stewardship of State funds.

Performance Indicators and Targets:

- Annual maintenance costs: Baseline: Elevated due to aging fleet → Target: 15% reduction in annual maintenance and repair costs
- Fuel efficiency: Baseline: Older, less fuel-efficient vehicles → Target: 10% improvement in average fuel efficiency (MPG)
- Vehicle utilization: Baseline: High mileage per vehicle → Target: Improved vehicle rotation and reduced average annual mileage per vehicle

Agency

For 60 years, HCEOC has assisted low-income individuals and families in improving their lives by administering Transportation, housing, energy, and food assistance. HCEOC has demonstrated its capability, knowledge, skills, and capacity to impact the lives of low-income people by serving approximately 5,000 economically disadvantaged people in Hawai'i County each year.

In 1965, community members established HCEOC as a Community Action Agency. In 1971, HCEOC received its 501(c)(3) Nonprofit Tax Exemption from the United States Department of the Treasury, Internal Revenue Service. Its mission is to prevent, alleviate, and mitigate poverty by providing services and programs for low-income, elderly, and individuals with disabilities in Hawai'i County. Over the years, HCEOC developed and continues to grow expertise and

working relationships with other community agencies to coordinate services. These agencies include:

- Government/Public: Hawai'i County Mass Transit Agency, Hawai'i County Office of Aging—Nutrition Program, Hawaii County Parks and Recreation Department—Elderly Activities Division and Recreation, the State Department of Labor and Industrial Relations-Office of Community Services, and the State Department of Human Services-Benefits, Employment, and Support Services Division
- Private: The Arc of Hilo, Brantley Center, Inc., Cooper Center Farmers Market, Dimple Creek Market, Easterseals Hawai'i, Hawaiian Community Lending, Hawaiian Fresh Products, Hilo Farmers' Market, HOPE Services Hawai'i, Keauhou Farmers Market, Kino'ole Farmers Market, KTA Superstores, Laupāhoehoe Farmers Market, Lions Club of Region VII, Men of Pa'a, OK Farms, Neighborhood Place of Puna, Waiākea Hawaiian Water, Waimea Mid Week Farmers Market

Personnel

HCEOC's Executive Director, Chad Hasegawa, joined HCEOC in 2016. The board of directors appointed Mr. Hasegawa as the Executive Director in 2020. He has served as the Deputy Director, Transportation Manager, and Housing Program Manager.

HCEOC's Deputy Director, Gregory Ayau, joined HCEOC in 2020. Mr. Ayau provides general oversight and administrative direction of financial operations of the organization.

HCEOC's Director of Operations, Loke Kuamo'o, joined HCEOC in 2021. Mrs. Kuamo'o provides general program oversight and administrative direction of programs' operations.

The Transportation Department has a Transportation Director who oversees the department. Ten drivers provide Transportation in Hawai'i County. The department also has a transportation coordinator, clerk, and mechanic.

The Fiscal Department oversees the organization's financial operations to ensure fiscal accountability and compliance with all federal, state, county, and funding source requirements. Responsibilities include budgeting and expenditure monitoring, maintaining accurate financial records, processing payroll and payments, preparing required fiscal reports, and managing audits and monitoring reviews. The department works closely with program staff to track grant expenditures, enforce internal controls and procurement standards, and ensure funds are used in accordance with contract terms.

The Administration Department comprises the Executive Director, Deputy Director, Executive Assistant, Resource and Development Coordinator, and Maintenance and Facilities workers. The Resource and Development Coordinator has over four years of experience with grant writing and implementation. The Executive Assistant has 15 years of customer service and administrative experience.

Governance

HCEOC maintains District Council Boards (DCBs) in each district in Hawai'i County. DCBs consist of low-income residents and supporters from low-income neighborhoods who meet regularly to review programs and services and advise the HCEOC administration. Each DCB elects a director; the DCB directors are essential to the governing board, comprising the low-income community sector of HCEOC's tripartite Board of Directors. The DCB is one of the features that distinguishes Community Action Agencies from other nonprofit organizations that serve the low-income population throughout the State of Hawai'i.

2. Facilities

HCEOC has five (5) office locations. Its central office is in Hilo at 47 Rainbow Drive, directly across the street from the Rainbow Falls State Park. This main office sits on three (3) acres of land.

The other three (3) locations include an office building on a 7,000-square-foot parcel in Nā'ālehu, a similar office building on a 6,000-square-foot property in Honoka'a, and a similar office setting in West Hawai'i/Kona. The fifth office is in Waikoloa Highlands Center, which houses the Mālama Kūpuna program. Each location is wheelchair accessible and meets the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

HCEOC currently has three 7-passenger vans and twelve 15-passenger vans. HCEOC has received an award from the Hawai'i Department of Transportation's 5310 Program. The Agency will use those funds to obtain five minivans, ten transit vans, and six new handicap accessible vans.
