

II. Background and Summary

1. Applicant Background

Ho'omaluhia Horse Rescue Hawai'i is a Hawai'i-based nonprofit organization dedicated to the rescue, rehabilitation, and humane care of horses and other livestock, while providing community education and public engagement opportunities centered on animal welfare and responsible stewardship. The organization operates a working rescue facility that supports daily animal care, volunteer engagement, and small-scale public programs that connect residents and visitors with rescued animals in a safe, educational environment.

2. Goals and Objectives Related to the Request

The goal of this request is to strengthen the organization's operational capacity and physical infrastructure in order to improve animal welfare, ensure public safety, and support sustainable program growth. Objectives include advancing permit-ready planning and engineering, completing phased facility improvements, installing permanent infrastructure systems, and formalizing staffing support necessary to administer and oversee grant-funded activities.

3. Public Purpose and Need

The requested funds address a demonstrated public need for safe, humane animal rescue services and accessible educational programming related to animal care and welfare. Existing infrastructure limitations constrain the organization's ability to safely house animals, manage quarantine and recovery needs, and host public-facing activities. Investment in facility improvements and program capacity will directly support animal health, regulatory compliance, volunteer coordination, and responsible public access.

4. Target Population to Be Served

The primary beneficiaries of the program are rescued horses and livestock requiring rehabilitation and long-term care. Secondary beneficiaries include community volunteers, local residents, schools, nonprofit partners, and members of the public

who participate in educational visits and service-based programming offered at the rescue facility.

5. Geographic Coverage

Services are provided on the island of O'ahu, with primary operations serving the surrounding North Shore and greater O'ahu community.

III. Service Summary and Outcomes

1. Scope of Work, Tasks, and Responsibilities

The proposed project combines capital facility improvements with operational support necessary to ensure safe, effective, and sustainable delivery of nonprofit animal rescue services and community-based programming. Capital activities will include professional design and engineering services; preparation of permit-ready plans; construction of covered animal care and common-use structures; modular quarantine and recovery spaces; reinforced enclosures; arena improvements; and installation of permanent water and utility infrastructure.

Operational activities supported by this request include essential staffing functions related to program administration, facility oversight, volunteer coordination, compliance monitoring, and grant reporting. Staff responsibilities will include coordinating capital project activities, overseeing contractors and vendors, maintaining compliance with County and State requirements, ensuring continuity of animal care during construction phases, and administering required financial and performance reporting.

2. Projected Annual Timeline

Project implementation will occur over the fiscal year using a phased approach. Initial activities will focus on completing design development, engineering, and permit preparation required for County approvals. Upon receipt of necessary approvals, construction activities will commence, prioritizing safety-related infrastructure improvements, covered animal care areas, and permanent utility systems.

Operational staffing and oversight will occur throughout the fiscal year to ensure uninterrupted animal care, volunteer engagement, and public-access programming while capital improvements are underway.

3. Quality Assurance and Evaluation Plans

Project implementation will be monitored through internal oversight, professional consultation, and regular review of budgets, timelines, and deliverables. Capital activities will be evaluated against approved plans and permit requirements, with adjustments made as needed to address site conditions, safety considerations, or regulatory requirements.

Operational performance will be evaluated through staff supervision, volunteer feedback, program tracking, and financial monitoring. The organization will maintain detailed records

related to expenditures, project milestones, and service delivery to ensure accountability and compliance with State requirements.

4. Measures of Effectiveness

The organization will report the following measures of effectiveness to the expending agency:

- Completion of permit-ready design and engineering plans
- Initiation or completion of phased capital improvement activities
- Installation of permanent infrastructure systems supporting animal care
- Increased capacity for safe animal housing, quarantine, and recovery
- Continuity of daily animal care and volunteer-supported operations during the fiscal year
- Timely submission of required grant reports and financial documentation

<p>JUSTIFICATION/COMMENTS: The requested capital funds will support a phased infrastructure expansion to improve animal care capacity, operational safety, and public access at the rescue facility. Funds will be used for professional design and engineering services, including preparation of permit-ready plans (structural, elevation, and electrical), as well as initial construction activities and installation of fixed infrastructure systems. Construction components include covered animal care and common-use structures, modular and container-based quarantine and recovery spaces, reinforced enclosures, arena improvements, and visitor safety enhancements. Fixed equipment costs include permanent water distribution systems essential to daily animal care. This project represents a critical phase in the organization's long-term facility development plan and will enable compliance with County requirements while supporting program sustainability and growth.</p>

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V. Experience and Capability

1. Necessary Skills and Experience

Ho'omaluhia Horse Rescue Hawai'i has demonstrated the organizational capacity, technical knowledge, and operational experience necessary to implement the proposed project. The organization has experience managing daily animal care operations, coordinating volunteers, administering nonprofit programs, and overseeing facility maintenance and improvements.

Over the past 2 years, the organization has successfully operated a working rescue facility, coordinated community-based programming, and managed professional services related to planning, engineering, and site improvements. Leadership and staff possess direct experience working with contractors, consultants, and regulatory agencies to advance facility-related projects while maintaining ongoing program operations.

2. Facilities

The organization operates a dedicated rescue facility located on O'ahu that supports daily animal care, volunteer activities, and limited public-access programming. Existing facilities include animal enclosures, pasture areas, and support spaces; however, infrastructure limitations currently restrict capacity, safety, and program expansion.

The proposed project will enhance existing facilities through phased capital improvements designed to support humane animal care, operational efficiency, regulatory compliance, and safe public engagement.

VI – PERSONNEL: PROJECT ORGANIZATION AND STAFFING

1. Proposed Staffing, Staff Qualifications, Supervision, and Training

The organization will utilize a combination of paid staff and volunteer support to implement the proposed project. Paid personnel supported through this request will provide program administration, facility oversight, volunteer coordination, compliance monitoring, and grant reporting. Staff possess relevant experience in nonprofit operations, animal care management, and project coordination.

Staff will be supervised by organizational leadership, with ongoing training and guidance provided to ensure compliance with safety standards, animal welfare best practices, and grant requirements.

2. Organization Chart

An organization chart illustrating staff roles and reporting relationships is available upon request and reflects clear lines of supervision and accountability for grant-funded activities.

3. Compensation

Compensation levels for organizational leadership and staff are conservative and commensurate with experience, responsibilities, and nonprofit sector standards. Salary ranges for the organization's highest compensated positions are provided in the accompanying budget documentation.

VII – OTHER

1. Litigation

The organization is not a party to any pending litigation and has no outstanding judgments.

2. Licensure or Accreditation

The organization complies with applicable federal, State, and County requirements relevant to nonprofit operations and animal care services.

3. Private Educational Institutions

Grant funds will not be used to support or benefit any sectarian or non-sectarian private educational institution.

4. Future Sustainability Plan

If grant funding is received for fiscal year 2027, the organization will utilize the funds to strengthen operational capacity and advance phased facility improvements that support long-term sustainability. Improved infrastructure and staffing capacity will enable expansion of program offerings, enhanced volunteer engagement, and pursuit of diversified funding sources.

If grant funding is not received beyond fiscal year 2027, the organization will continue operations at a reduced pace using available resources while pursuing alternative funding opportunities, including private donations, grants, and earned program revenue, to support future phases of development.
