

II. Background and Summary

1. A brief description of the applicant's background;

The Inspiration Hawaii Museum is a new museum scheduled to open full-time to the public in Fall 2026. It is currently operating part-time with special events.

The museum has acquired a physical location at 900 Richards street on the ground floor of the historic old HECO building downtown. In 2025, some exhibits were built, and several public events were held last year. There were many educational and career workshops for the public. The museum hosted HONOLULU TECH WEEK from Sept 7-12, 2025. We are currently hosting the 50th Anniversary of the voyage of the Hōkūleʻa Art exhibition with the Puʻuhonua

Society from December 7, 2025, to January 25, 2026. The popular Hōkūle'a art exhibit was open to the public for two months with free admission.

In 2025, the Inspiration Hawaii Museum held 15 events that were open to the general public. All museum programs and workshops were educational with themes tied to our exhibits.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request;

The facility is 99 years old, built in 1927. Several electrical outlets in the main exhibition room needs to be repaired. We have exhibits with videos that require an electrical outlet nearby. The museum is a tenant that accepted the facility in "as is" condition. The repairs and renovations are the tenant's responsibility.

3. The public purpose and need to be served;

The public purpose is **educational** and to change stereotypes about people from Hawaii. Curated all in one place, our exhibits tell the stories of remarkable people from Hawaii who made an impact on the world.

4. Describe the target population to be served; and

In 2025, the Museum welcomed Hawaii residents, visitors, and new residents. We had families with children. With funding in 2026 - 2027, we can arrange special tours for schools designed for students of all ages.

5. Describe the geographic coverage.

The museum is in the Historic Capitol District in downtown Honolulu. "Downtown belongs to everyone." We attract people and we are helping to revitalize downtown.

In 2025, the museum attracted people from all over Oahu. We had teenagers from Waianae and young adults from Kahuku. We welcomed residents from Kailua, Kaneohe, Aiea, Waipahu, Ewa, Nanakuli, Kapolei, Pearl City, Hawaii Kai, Kalihi, Makiki, Kaaawa, Hauula, Laie, Kahala, Manoa, Kaimuki, Downtown and Chinatown.

We had tourist from Waikiki and from ships docked at Aloha Tower.

With additional funding we will create online opportunities for families on the neighbor islands. The Museum's website will expand coverage to include online programs for teachers and students on the neighbor islands.

Capital Improvement

Repairing electrical outlets will allow the museum to increase the number of its exhibits. The exhibits are arranged around the perimeter of a large historic ballroom, like the shape of a donut, with the center of the room left open for large events.

The electrical outlets that are working, power the video monitors used at the following museum exhibits: Miss Aloha Hula winners, Olympic Gold Medal Winners, Joseph Kekuku (invented the steel guitar) President Obama, Patsy Mink, Senator Inouye, Actor Jason Mamoia, Hawaiian Sumo Champions, singers Israel Kamakawiwo'ole and Iam Tongi.

The following museum exhibits lack a working electric outlet. Their videos cannot be shown until repairs are made. Pro-Football players, Baseball players, Dwayne Johnson, Bruno Mars, Bette Midler, Strat guitar inventor Freddie Tavares, National High School Cheerleader champions Radford, National Break-dancing champion, National Robotics Champions.

Honolulu Tech Week was a big event at the museum Sept 7-14, 2025. For **Tech Week 2026, we plan to open our Science and Technology room profiling Hawaii's inventors and patent holders and Nobel Prize winner in Biology, plus our Astronauts.** There are two electrical outlets in our tech room, but they do not work, they need to be repaired.



Tim Johns was President and CEO of the Bishop Museum from 2007-2011. He was CCO at Hawaii Medical Service Association from 2011-2017. VP and General Counsel for AMFAC Property Development. He is currently the President and CEO Zephyr Insurance and on the board of directors for Hawaiian Electric Company, Parker Ranch, Polynesian Voyaging Society.

Lance Wilhelm was past Chairman and Trustee at Kamehameha Schools. He is the founder and President of the Wilhelm Group. He serves on the board for Hawaii Pacific University.

Meladie Ide was President and CEO of the Bishop Museum from 2018-2023. She is an architect and was the museum designer for the Smithsonian Institute, Museum of Natural History, Clinton Presidential Library, Obama Presidential Center.

Paul Kosasa is the President and CEO of ABC Stores. He is Chair of the Hawaii Symphony Orchestra.

Pili Lee Loy is an education advisor. She was a teacher for 46 years at Aliamanu Middle school and served as Chairman at the Employee's Retirement System of Hawaii as the Trustee for Teachers. She is a trustee of the Hawaii Education Association and serves on the board of the King Kamehameha Judiciary History Center.

Myles Shibata is the former Chair of the Honolulu Japanese Chamber of Commerce. He was VP of Philanthropic Services at Hawaii Community Foundation and COO of the Grand Hyatt Kauai.

Gloria Borland is the museum's founder and the leader of the startup. She moved into the facility, designed the initial exhibits and organized more than 15 events held in 2025. She researched the biographies of 150 people to be included in the exhibits. Gloria Borland was invited by the American Historical Association to present her research on President Obama, Senator Inouye and Congresswoman Mink at their Pacific Coast conference at the East West Center in 2024.







The Inspiration Hawaii Museum will use State funding received during fiscal year 2027 to make repairs to the electrical outlets in the main exhibition room. The museum is a tenant that accepted the facility in "as is" condition with repairs the responsibility of the tenant.

With electrical repairs the museum can open to the general public. When fully open, the museum can become sustainable from collecting entrance fees, gift shop revenues, and can rent space for special events.
