




**Lahui 'o Ko'olauloa Canoe Club is an IRS-designated 501(c)(3) non-profit public service organization incorporated in Hawaii that provides traditional outrigger paddling and cultural experiences to the public. The Club provided nearly 30,000 seat-hours of training, education, and recreational and race activities from Sep 2024 to Dec 2025.**

**Emphasizing environmental stewardship, the Club's activities enhance the public's safety, health, well-being, and resilience. Youth programs develop skills, fitness, teamwork and character. Adult and Kupuna programs improve health, expand and deepen community relationships, and enable the elderly to thrive actively in intergenerational programs.**

**Lahui is the only outrigger canoe club on the entire stretch of coastline between Kahalu'u and Haleiwa and has been leading community paddling from its Kahana Bay home waters for a decade.**

2. The goals and objectives related to the request;

**This request is for capital funding to build a Hālau Wa'a (teaching pavilion and shelter) at Ahupua'a 'O Kahana State Park. Funding will enable the project to be completed from initial planning through construction and certification for public use.**

***Note: The Hālau Wa'a project has been unanimously endorsed by the Ko'olauloa Neighborhood Board and multiple Community Associations from Ka'a'awa-Kahana, Punalu'u, Hau'ula, and Kahuku.***

3. The public purpose and need to be served;

**There are currently no pavilions at Ahupua'a O Kahana State Park, and no nā Hālau Wa'a on the entire ~40 mile stretch of Oahu coastline from Kahalu'u to Haleiwa.**

**A Hālau Wa'a will improve public safety, provide an inviting covered gathering space for the community, and establish an enduring cultural landmark that will symbolize Hawaiian traditions for generations to come.**

**The Hālau Wa'a will serve the public by providing a covered space where the public can gather and learn in safety, protected from the harsh environment at Kahana Bay. The Hālau Wa'a will protect the public from lightning, falling branches, UV radiation, driving rain and high winds prevalent at Kahana Bay.**

**The Hālau Wa'a will also protect canoes and equipment that the public can use under the supervision of the Club. Vital equipment currently sits out in the open and is vulnerable. Protecting equipment will reduce maintenance costs and free up funds for people programs and scholarships.**

**A Hālau Wa'a at Kahana Bay would establish an enduring cultural landmark that symbolizes Hawaiian traditions, visible and open to all who visit or pass by. The Moku of Ko'olauloa is a rural, generally underprivileged region, and a Hālau Wa'a would be a source of public pride and improve community spirit and morale.**

4. Describe the target population to be served; and

**The target population is the general public from keiki to kupuna. The inclusive and non-discriminatory Club welcomes everyone and accommodates the disabled. The Club provides scholarships for underprivileged individuals and families to participate.**

Describe the geographic coverage.

**Most participants tend to reside in the Moku of Ko'olauloa, population about 20,000, and from Kaneohe to Kualoa, population 60,000. The Club also serves people from other parts of Oahu and other Hawaiian Islands, along with guests from around the world.**

### **III. Service Summary and Outcomes**

OP funds would be requested if the State did not agree to maintain the structure since it would be located in a state park.**

**If those approaches were unsuccessful, the Club would obtain funding from other public or private grants. The Club has a successful track record of obtaining grants and is confident the Club would be able to do so for this project if FY2027 GIA funds were insufficient.**
