Across the nation, YMCAs are committed to helping children and youth deepen positive values, their commitment to service and their motivation to learn. Families build stronger bonds, spend time together and become more engaged with their communities. Driven by the YMCA mission "To put Christian principles into practice through programs that build healthy spirit, mind, and body for all" individuals strengthen their spiritual, mental and physical well-being.

The YMCA of Kaua'i is a charitable non-profit organization, qualifying under section 501 (c) (3) of the U.S. tax code that has operated continuously since 1916.

YMCA of Kaua'i has operated in a manner consistent with the values of caring, honesty, respect, and responsibility, is governed by committed, well-trained, well-informed volunteers and operated so that programs are accessible and affordable to all sections of the community.

YMCA Camp Naue consists of 4 acres of beach front property donated to the YMCA of Kaua'i in 1926 by McBryde Sugar Mill company. Camp Naue is a very special place, it is known for its beach front bunkhouses surrounded by mountains with cascading waterfalls. Situated along the North Shore in the heart of Hā'ena, this deeply rooted community Camp has welcomed generations of keiki, 'ohana, and local groups to connect with nature, with each other, and with a sense of kuleana and connection. It is the focus of family camps, youth camps, outdoor education, and numerous church and club gatherings on Kauai. Over the years some of the groups that have enjoyed Camp Naue are Island School, Rotary Club, Kauai Christian Fellowship, Aloha Schools, various Hawaiian culture-based charter schools statewide, Boys and Girls Scouts, and Camp Agape, to name a few.

Camp Naue also has served as an emergency center, helicopter landing zone for rescue, supply drops, utility workers and other emergency operations and distribution in the April Flooding of 2018 and after Hurricane Iniki back in the early 1990's.

Since the change in caretakers for YMCA's Camp Naue, back in October 2016, there's been significant clearing of invasive trees with the goal of one day doing a native plant reforestation project. After believed to be lost from Naue forever from the tidal waves devastation, the Director of Limahuli Garden and Preserve Lei Wann, and her very inspiring story, was able to locate the original, DNA matched Hala of Naue, and they nursed the descendants from it. With their collaboration, a grove of 27 Hala's, have been planted at YMCA Camp Naue and an agroforest started, to allow us to step back in time, before gps, where story tells that's how the Hala of Naue was used as a landmark to announce to people from other places that they had made it to Hā'ena. And as David Bryant, Director of Communications for the National Tropical Botanical Garden, said: "These leaves are literally woven into Hawaiian culture".

It's just one more reminder of YMCA's Camp Naue cultural significance not only as landmark for Hā'ena, but a place known for cultural gathering and countless stories of participating in YMCA Camp Naue's camps throughout history and generations to come.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request;

The goals of the improvements planned to be cover with this financial support is for Camp Naue to be able to continue to support, serve and receive in a safe and clean matter an estimate of over 7500 people that enjoy the use of this facility throughout a year.

The objectives to ensure YMCA Camp Naue can fulfill these services through the year is to complete the following improvement projects:

Restrooms

- Full restoration of the restrooms building

Bunkhouses

- Rebuild stairs and railings
- Replace all the bunkhouses rotten doors and hardware
- Shore up and replace the wood leg piers on the bunkhouses as needed

Kūpuna Cottage

- Rebuild stairs and railings and landing deck
- Replace rotten floor on the bathroom, replace hot water line and install a water heater, install a smaller sink to provide better access inside the bathrooms, replace the plumbing for the sink
- Replace the lanai fixed rotten jalousies for new windows that can be closed during the rain

Caretakers house

- Replace rotten stairs treads with new ones and new hardware
- Replace rotten railing and rotten hardware on landing area as needed

Dinning hall

- Replace existing stoves for commercial grade stoves
- Replenish kitchen utensils as needed (pots, cups, pans, etc)
- Replace old sink faucets, plumbing and drain as needed
- Replace gas line to stoves as needed

General

- Replace broken Camp washer with new one
- Replace old broken grills BBQ with new ones
- Acquire a mower
- Acquire a computer and printer
- Remove broken chain link fence and replace
- Supply the buildings with fire extinguishers
- Supply Camp Naue with 2 generators for the extended power outages with road closures
- To have a contingency fund for emergency project that may arise during the year

Pavilion

- Replace rotten hardware, rotten posts, rotten railings and electrical as needed

Hala of Naue grove

- Remove natural cut coconuts stumps barrier that's protecting the keiki plants because of the risk of Coconut Rhinoceros Beetle, and install hog fence to allow the grove time to grow

3. The public purpose and need to be served;

The benefit for the community that utilize YMCA Camp Naue for their different activities is to provide them with safe and clean facilities in a healthy environment and at a culturally significant location.

For almost 100 years, Camp Naue has given the community a place to gather from weavers, meetings, retreats, first responder hub during emergencies, family parties, school groups and other entities, over 7500 people a year uses these facilities.

Camp Naue is also proud to keep providing through great efforts a completely smoke and drug free environment where youth can thrive.

4. Describe the target population to be served; and

YMCA Camp Naue mostly host people from all Islands and some groups from the mainland specially schools. From keiki to kūpuna, family reunions, cultural groups, schools and churches.

Camp Naue host neighborhood meetings and has served as emergency hub as needed for first responders.

As a cultural landmark it benefits everyone that drives by Camp Naue and can see the important Hala of Naue grove.

5. Describe the geographic coverage.

We are located on Kuhio Hwy, 4 miles west of Hanalei and 2 miles from the end of the road, on Kaua'i's North Shore.

We serve people from all islands and around the world.

III. Service Summary and Outcomes

The YMCA Camp Naue, current facilities house buildings dated back to 1950's. The purpose of this request is to address the condition of our buildings and green areas, improving the safety of all of those attending our facilities. A retrofit needs to be completed to keep them operational for generations to come.

YMCA Camp Naue is requesting funds in the amount of \$483,175.00 to renovate and reconfigure the restrooms building, the pavilion, the bunkhouses, the kūpuna cottage, the dining hall, the caretakers house, and for other general areas of the Camp. The result will be safe operational buildings and green areas for all Camp guests.

Scope of work: Renovating existing facilities, upgrading infrastructure, improving accessibility, improving safety and cleanliness

Tasks & Responsibilities: once funds are approved, scheduling work will commence, schedule meets with contractors as needed, do material takeoffs, keep Director informed, keep track of work and accounts. Submit progress reports.

2. Provide a projected annual timeline for accomplishing the results or outcomes of the service;

The restoration plans and project will commence as soon as funds are granted.

When funds are secured work will begin with a flexible adaptable timeline, as YMCA Camp Naue, receives over 7500 people a year. Camp Naue would schedule the work accordingly to the group scheduling so all services can continue.

Contractors will be contacted as needed once funds are allocated, renovations and upgrades schedule will be managed by caretakers with a construction project management background.

Projects would be planned to be completed within a 1 year timeframe of receiving the necessary funds.

Urgency of upgrades and repairs as follows:

Bunkhouses: replace stairs, railings, doors, shore up legs and replace footings as needed

Kūpuna Cottage: replace stairs, stair landing, railing, post, bathroom floor, sink, sink plumbing, install water heater and new water lines. Replace lanai windows.

Dinning hall: replace sink faucets, plumbing, gas lines, stoves and small cooking utensils (pots, pans, etc)

Purchase of equipment and others: quote and purchase mower, pressure washer, washer, computer, printer, generators, stainless meters, bbq grills.

Caretakers house: replace stairs treads and rotten sections on stair landing

Pavilion: shore up rotten post, frame and railings and replace as needed

Restrooms: upgrade and renovate all plumbing, drains, showers, roof, stalls, outdoor showers, doors, walls and lighting. Add accessible bathroom/shower.

Fence: secure Hala of Naue keiki plants grove with hog fence in replacement of natural cut coconut barrier per concern of coconut Rhinoceros Beetle.

Fence: replace failing/rusted chain link fence with hog fence

The current YMCA Camp Naue caretakers have a construction background, project management experience on public works construction, as well as a sociology degree and social work background; with over 9 years of having the caretaker position at Camp Naue and overseeing multiple projects during their time at Camp Naue, they will be monitoring the project and reporting to the YMCA of Kaua'i Director directly before during and after the projects are completed to ensure every project meets the require specifications.

The YMCA caretakers background qualifies them to monitor the state of the grounds and assess priorities and oversee the completion of task to the require specifications. Work will be documented with pictures.

YMCA Camp Naue has a long-standing reputation for programs and management withing it's 100-year history.

As previously mentioned the YMCA caretakers' construction, project management on public works, and sociology background and the years of experience overseeing other Camp Naue projects as well as seeing over the daily needs of the Camp, this all provides them with the necessary skills, abilities and knowledge to oversee the proposed improvements included on this request and they will answer directly to YMCA of Kaua'i Director Tom Tannery, Phd. Who in turns answers to the YMCA of Kauai Board of Directors.

Contracts and related projects do not apply for the last 3 years and that's why there's a current need for these projects and improvements. The last grant allocated to Camp Naue and the last grant Camp Naue applied for was in 2019, through Kaua'i Community Foundation, after the historical floods and with that Cam Naue was able to install new roofs for the bunkhouses and dining hall, new windows for the bunkhouses and a lift to the inside of the bunkhouses with new paint and mattresses covers. At the time through a United Way donation to Camp Naue, the dining hall received a full paint lift as well.

Sustained through resilience and thanks to the ongoing support from local volunteers and donors, Camp Naue has seen decades worth of renovations and improvements in the last 10 years. From repairing aging cabins to upgrading kitchens and bathrooms, every effort reflects the community's love and commitment to Camp Naue. But the salt air and humidity wear down Camp Naue's very aged buildings fast and it is time for much needed renovations to be able to keep serving the community for generations to come.

2. Facilities

YMCA of Kaua'i owns the land and buildings designated for the project. It's a 4 acre property and has 2 bunkhouses that hold 50 people, 1 kupuna cottage, 1 dinning hall, 1 pavilion, 1 mini pavilion, 1 bathroom building and 1 caretaker house.

Being just steps from the ocean brings unique challenges to Camp Naue facilities: salt air and humidity wear down building and materials, flooding and erosion require constant mitigations, vegetation overgrowth demands regular clearing and care, yet even in the face of nature's force, Camp Naue remains a place of service and refuge.



caretakers at YMCA Camp Naue, Barama Osothsongkroh and Nice Chinchilla, will be overseeing the projects and reporting to the Director as they are on site.


