
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ASSISTED COMMUNITY TREATMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 334-121, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 **"PART VIII. ASSISTED COMMUNITY TREATMENT**

4

5 **§334-121 Criteria for assisted community treatment.** An
6 individual may be ordered to obtain assisted community treatment
7 if the family court finds, based on the professional opinion of
8 a qualified psychiatric examiner, that:

9 (1) The individual is mentally ill or suffering from
10 substance abuse;

11 (2) The individual is unlikely to live safely in the
12 community without available supervision, is now in
13 need of treatment in order to prevent a relapse or
14 deterioration that would predictably result in the
15 individual becoming imminently dangerous to self or
16 others, and the individual's current mental status or
17 the nature of the individual's disorder limits or



1 negates the individual's ability to make an informed
2 decision to voluntarily seek or comply with
3 recommended treatment;

4 (3) The individual has a:

8 (B) History of lack of adherence to treatment for
9 mental illness or substance abuse that resulted
10 in the individual becoming dangerous to self or
11 others and that now would predictably result in
12 the individual becoming imminently dangerous to
13 self or others; [and] or

16 (4) Considering less intrusive alternatives, assisted
17 community treatment is essential to prevent the danger
18 posed by the individual, is medically appropriate, and
19 is in the individual's medical interests."

20 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
21 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
