A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VOTER REGISTRATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 11-15.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 **"[f]§11-15.5[] Duties of all state agencies; voter**
4 **registration.** (a) Each state agency that deals with the public
5 shall make available to each member of the public eighteen years
6 of age or older an application in the form of an affidavit for
7 voter registration pursuant to section 11-15. The application
8 shall be available by mail or in person depending on the manner
9 in which the agency's services are requested by the person. The
10 form of the application may be identical to that described and
11 found in public telephone directories.

12 (b) Each state agency that deals with the public and
13 collects or cross-references reliable personal information
14 indicating citizenship status may provide that an application
15 for a license, permit, program, or service shall serve as a
16 dual-purpose application. If the state agency chooses to



1 process any application as a dual-purpose application, the
2 application shall:

3 (1) Serve as an application for voter registration;
4 (2) Allow an applicant to change the applicant's
5 registered residence address or name as it appears on
6 the voter registration rolls; and
7 (3) Provide the applicant with an opportunity to
8 affirmatively decline to register to vote or change
9 the applicant's registered residence address or name
10 by providing a check box on the application form
11 without requiring the applicant to state a reason.

12 Dual-purpose applications shall not be processed until the
13 applicant completes the portion of the application related to
14 voter registration and indicates the applicant's choice of
15 whether to register to vote.

16 The submission of the dual-purpose application shall be
17 deemed to authorize the director of the respective state agency
18 to collect and transmit only the information necessary to
19 register the applicant as a voter if the applicant chose to
20 register or to make changes to the applicant's voter
21 registration information unless the applicant declined to make



1 changes. The director of the respective state agency may
2 electronically transmit the necessary information to the clerk
3 of the county in which the applicant resides, election
4 officials, and the online voter registration system pursuant to
5 subsection (d).

6 The director of the respective state agency shall not
7 transmit any information necessary to register an applicant as a
8 voter if the applicant chose not to be registered to vote, nor
9 transmit any information necessary to make changes to the
10 applicant's voter registration information if the applicant
11 declined to make changes. The director of the respective state
12 agency shall not transmit any information related to a voter
13 application or changes to the applicant's voter registration
14 information if the applicant presents a document demonstrating a
15 lack of United States citizenship.

16 (c) Upon receipt of the completed dual-purpose application
17 transmitted from the director of the respective state agency,
18 the clerk shall review and either approve or reject the voter
19 registration application in accordance with this part; provided
20 that an approved voter registration application received from
21 the director of the respective state agency pursuant to this



1 section shall be treated as having a valid signature for
2 purposes of section 11-15(c), whether transmitted electronically
3 or by facsimile transmission. Upon the clerk's approval of the
4 voter registration application or any changes to the voter
5 registration information, the clerk shall number the application
6 and register the name of the voter in the general county
7 register as provided in section 11-14 or make approved changes
8 to the voter's existing voter registration information as
9 applicable.

10 (d) Databases maintained or operated by each state agency
11 offering dual-purpose applications containing dual-purpose
12 application information, including any documents or images, may
13 be accessible and provided electronically to election officials
14 and the online voter registration system to allow for the timely
15 processing of voter applications, ensure the integrity of the
16 voter registration rolls, and for any other voter registration
17 or election purposes, as determined by the director of the
18 respective state agency offering dual-purpose applications.

19 (e) For the purposes of this section:

20 "Dual-purpose application" means an application, an
21 application for renewal, a change of address form, or a



1 recertification form for a license, permit, program, or service
2 offered by a state agency that also serves as an application to
3 register to vote in the State.

4 "Reliable personal information" means information about
5 individuals obtained from government sources that may be used to
6 verify whether an individual is eligible to register to vote."

7 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

9 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
