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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1       SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the existing  
2       statewide public high school social studies curriculum does not  
3       sufficiently integrate Asian American history, including the  
4       significant contributions of the 100th Infantry Battalion during  
5       World War II. Despite the large percentage of Asian American  
6       residents in the State, an underrepresentation of Asian American  
7       history in educational settings contributes to marginalization  
8       and racial stereotypes.

9       The legislature further finds that integrating narratives  
10      from Asian American history aligns with the state social studies  
11      content standards. Notably, History Anchor Standard 17, Change,  
12      Continuity, and Contest and Content Standard SS.US.8.17.2  
13      requires students to assess the social, political, and economic  
14      transformation of the United States during World War II. The  
15      100th Infantry Battalion was composed primarily of Japanese  
16      American soldiers and began its training in the Territory of  
17      Hawaii. The Battalion's narrative therefore can offer students



1 an exemplary opportunity to learn of their valor despite the  
2 discrimination they faced and engage with history through a  
3 local and multicultural lens.

4 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:

5 (1) Require the department of education to implement a  
6 curricula plan that integrates the history of the  
7 100th Infantry Battalion into public high school  
8 social studies courses beginning with the 2027-2028  
9 school year; and

10 (2) Require the department of education to implement a  
11 100th Infantry Battalion history curriculum pilot  
12 program beginning with the 2026-2027 school year.

13 This Act may be known and cited as the Hawaii 100th  
14 Infantry Battalion Curriculum and Heritage Act.

15 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
16 amended by adding a new section to part II, subpart B, to be  
17 appropriately designated and to read as follows:

18 "§302A- 100th Infantry Battalion history; social  
19 studies; curricula plan; public schools. (a) The department  
20 shall develop and, beginning with the 2027-2028 school year,  
21 implement a statewide 100th Infantry Battalion history curricula



1 plan for public school students in grades nine through twelve,  
2 which shall be implemented within social studies courses of  
3 study.

4 (b) A minimum of hours of instruction of the 100th  
5 Infantry Battalion history curricula between grades nine through  
6 twelve shall be required for each student prior to graduation  
7 from high school.

8 (c) The 100th Infantry Battalion history curricula shall  
9 include but not be limited to:

10 (1) Studying the formation and composition of the 100th  
11 Infantry Battalion, including its segregated status  
12 and issues with historic anti-Asian sentiments;

13 (2) Assessing the formation and activities of the 442nd  
14 Regimental Combat Team;

15 (3) Identifying the combat achievements of the 100th  
16 Infantry Battalion, including its participation in  
17 notable battles and receipt of decorations;

18 (4) Evaluating the legacy and influence of the 100th  
19 Infantry Battalion, including its role in the  
20 desegregation of the armed services of the United



1 States and contributions to Asian American cultural  
2 heritage; and

3 (5) Integrating local history into the broader national  
4 context, including contextualizing the 100th Infantry  
5 Battalion in Asian American history more broadly.

6 (d) The department shall establish curriculum guidelines  
7 and distribute information about appropriate curriculum  
8 materials to each public school and make available in-service  
9 training programs based upon instruction provided for and the  
10 curriculum guidelines established pursuant to this section.

11 (e) Public schools may utilize:

12 (1) Any curriculum that complies with the requirements of  
13 this section;

14 (2) Programs made available by the department or from  
15 alternative sources; provided that the programs are  
16 deemed consistent with this section; and

17 (3) Any appropriate public or private materials,  
18 personnel, and other resources in developing and  
19 implementing the program of instruction.

20 (f) The department shall work in consultation with  
21 organizations and individuals that provide educational expertise



1 and resources related to the history of the 100th Infantry  
2 Battalion to develop the curriculum guidelines.

3 (g) As used in this section:

4 "100th Infantry Battalion" means the decorated unit  
5 composed of second-generation Japanese Americans activated  
6 June 12, 1942, that served in World War II and exemplified  
7 loyalty, community, and sacrifice.

8 "Asian American history" means the contributions,  
9 collective resistance, and achievements of Asian Americans  
10 throughout the history of the United States.

11 "Cultural heritage" means the traditions and histories  
12 shaping a community's identity, including those specific to  
13 Asian American and Pacific Islander groups in the State."

14 SECTION 3. (a) There is established within the department  
15 of education a one-year 100th Infantry Battalion history  
16 curriculum pilot program within a select number of public high  
17 schools during the 2026-2027 school year; provided that the  
18 department of education shall select the participating public  
19 high schools pursuant to the requirements of this section and  
20 available funding.



1 (b) The department of education shall develop and  
2 implement a 100th Infantry Battalion history curricula plan for  
3 students in grades nine through twelve at participating public  
4 schools. The curricula plan shall include the history of the  
5 100th Infantry Battalion, its role in World War II, and  
6 contextualization of that information as it relates to Asian  
7 American history in the United States.

8 (c) During the course of the pilot program, the department  
9 of education shall require the teaching of the 100th Infantry  
10 Battalion history curricula plan to be included in existing  
11 social studies courses required for each student.

12 (d) The department of education shall submit a report of  
13 its findings and recommendations, including any proposed  
14 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior  
15 to the convening of the regular session of 2027.

16 (e) As used in this section, "public school" has the same  
17 meaning as defined in section 302A-101, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

18 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.

19 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2026.

**Report Title:**

DOE; Public Schools; 100th Infantry Battalion; Asian American History; Curricula Plan; Pilot Program; Report

**Description:**

Requires the Department of Education to develop and implement a 100th Infantry Battalion history curricula plan beginning with the 2027-2028 school year. Establishes a one-year 100th Infantry Battalion history curriculum pilot program within certain public high schools during the 2026-2027 school year. Requires a report to the Legislature.
